



It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.





## CLERGY REFLECTION

This week we celebrate All Saints Day (November 1) followed by All Souls Day (November 2). It is a unique couple days in the Church calendar during which we are specifically reminded that we are all called to be saints. We are also reminded of all the saints who have preceded us into eternity and are available to pray for us and intercede for us whenever we ask them.

All Souls Day is a day when we remember all those from our parish, and our own families, who have died and all those in purgatory in need of our prayers. It is critically important that we pray regularly for all those who have gone before us. It is a Spiritual Work of Mercy.

The great mystic, St. Gertrude, received a private revelation of a prayer that would release 1,000 souls from purgatory every time she prayed it. We don't know how it relates to our prayers but we do know that the souls in purgatory need our prayers to end their time of purification and enter their eternal reward in heaven. Approximately 110 billion people have lived and died since God created man and woman. I don't think we ever need worry about there being no souls in purgatory to pray for. However, what a wonderful thing it would be if our prayers dramatically reduced the number of souls in need of our prayers.

There are approximately 900 families in our parish. If God's revelation to St. Gertrude extends to us as well, and If just one person from each of our families prayed the prayer of St. Gertrude the Great on November 2nd, almost 1 million souls would be free of purgatory and enjoying their eternal reward because we prayed for them!! That is one million souls in just one day!! So please join me in praying for the souls in purgatory on a regular basis and especially on All Souls Day. If you desire to use the Prayer of St. Gertrude, here it is:
