

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

### FIRST READING

1 Kings 17:10-16

In those days, Elijah the prophet went to Zarephath. As he arrived at the entrance of the city, a widow was gathering sticks there; he called out to her, “Please bring me a small cupful of water to drink.” She left to get it, and he called out after her, “Please bring along a bit of bread.” She answered, “As the Lord, your God, lives, I have nothing baked; there is only a handful of flour in my jar and a little oil in my jug. Just now I was collecting a couple of sticks, to go in and prepare something for myself and my son; when we have eaten it, we shall die.” Elijah said to her, “Do not be afraid. Go and do as you propose. But first make me a little cake and bring it to me. Then you can prepare something for yourself and your son. For the Lord, the God of Israel, says, “The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the Lord sends rain upon the earth.”” She left and did as Elijah had said. She was able to eat for a year, and he and her son as well; the jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

with blood that is not his own; if that were so, he would have had to suffer repeatedly from the foundation of the world. But now once for all he has appeared at the end of the ages to take away sin by his sacrifice. Just as it is appointed that human beings die once, and after this the judgment, so also Christ, offered once to take away the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to take away sin but to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him.

Mark 12:38-44

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation."

He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

## CLERGY REFLECTION

---

We know that the gift of faith and religious belief help us to attain life in the afterlife, but have you ever thought how much faith and religious belief help us get through this life also? Take our First Reading today from 1Kings: Elijah's great trust in God ensures that he and a widow and her son will not run out of food in order to survive. The widow takes even a greater leap of faith, trusting in Elijah's words, not knowing his status as divine messenger. Such is the widow in the Gospel story: Her gift to the collection plate, though a pittance, was a great leap of faith because she gave from her need, not from her surplus. Our Psalmist reminds us that if we give ourselves over to the Lord, He will not abandon us: "The Lord keeps faith forever." And finally in our Second Reading, the author of Hebrews assures us that the sacrifice of Christ has cancelled our sins, so that we might respond then with true faith and devotion. Religion and faith help us to cope with adversity. For example, people who practice religion live longer on the average than those who don't. One reason for this is that they tend to be healthier because they're more likely to face up to addictive behaviors. Religious believers are less likely to succumb to depression or commit suicide. They recover faster from illnesses; and they get over the death of a loved one faster. Irish journalist, David Quinn, says that one reason believers can cope better with adversity is because they have a source outside themselves to which they can turn, and that helps them to accept whatever is in store for them. "When all is lost, it allows them to accept that fact, and not to rage against it. They are more able, then, to seek forgiveness for any wrong they may have done and therefore go to God in peace." Religious belief allows us to hope against hope when the odds are stacked against us. Jesus ... we trust in You!
