

Who is the King of your universe? Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. I encourage you to reflect on how Jesus is the Lord and King of your life and the world around you.

I would like to share two incidents this past week where I experienced Jesus' love and kingship in a profound way. Those who attended the 11:00 a.m. Mass last Sunday would have witnessed Bishop Donald DeGrood administering the Rite of Candidacy to four men who are currently in formation discerning the Permanent Diaconate for our diocese. In this rite, the men who are seeking ordination publicly pronounce their intentions to offer themselves to God and the Church and to exercise the sacred order of deacon. It is a powerful witness from these men and their wives to surrender their lives to Christ's sovereignty allowing him to be Lord over them. It is a public statement before the Bishop and Church faithful that their lives are not their own but are now under the kingship of Jesus.

Part of their continuing formation involves a prison practicum in which they are to minister in some way to the incarcerated. Julie and I have the privilege of mentoring two of the Candidates while they are fulfilling their practicum at the Minnehaha County Jail. It's been a great experience ministering beside them while they share the love of Jesus with those who are in desperate need. One of the Candidates has a great gift of singing and playing the guitar. We decided to try something new by ministering to the inmates with praise and worship songs. Last week we asked ladies who are incarcerated at the jail to join us in the recreation room for praise and worship. It was a powerful experience to watch the Holy Spirit heal wounds, mend hearts and release pain from their souls through music. The rec room we were using faces west looking up the hill toward the Cathedral of St. Joseph. The spires of the Cathedral are visible from the very top of the high rec room windows that are covered with bars. When we were finished singing, I asked the ladies to join me in a closing prayer. As I did so I pointed out to them that Jesus was truly present just up the hill at the Cathedral in the tabernacle. As I began to pray, the large group of ladies spontaneously turned around and raised their hands towards the Cathedral. I was profoundly struck by how these ladies were raising their hands and acknowledging Jesus Christ as their Lord and King right where they were—behind bars!

As we are given the gift of Jesus' real presence as our Lord and King during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, let's pray for the grace to allow him to have complete sovereignty over our lives. Believe me—he will meet you right where you are!
