CLERGY REFLECTION

During the coming days and weeks our hearts will be warmed in hearing the old, familiar songs and Scripture readings of this holy season. We strive mightily to joyfully celebrate this season but our joy is often tempered by suffering. It may be our own personal suffering or that being experienced by loved ones or even complete strangers we encounter. During the past few weeks, I have encountered what feels like an unusually high amount of pain, stress and suffering in many of those I visit or come in contact with. Some of this has been in my own extended family, and among some of my closest friends.

Many in our parish family have a great love and reverence for the Rosary. I share those feelings. At Christmas time The Joyful Mysteries most completely capture the emotions of the season. 1) **The Annunciation**, 2) **the Visitation**, 3) **the Incarnation / birth of Jesus**, 4) **Mary and Joseph's Presentation of Jesus in the Temple** and 5) **the Finding of Jesus in the Temple**; all carry moments of great joy. It is pretty obvious why they are called The Joyful Mysteries.

What we often miss is that each of these mysteries also carry great moments of stress, sorrow and suffering. Rather than provide some examples of the joy and sorrow for each mystery, I thought it would be more fruitful to take time on your own to pray with each of these mysteries and listen to what the Holy Spirit makes known to you in your heart. Don't try to do it all at once. In the coming days, select one mystery at a time and sit quietly pondering the depth of that mystery. Put yourself right in there with Mary and Joseph. What were they feeling? What would you be feeling if it had been you? What are the joys in each of these mysteries? What might have been the sufferings?

Odd as it may seem, there is often a fine line between joy and suffering. As joyful as we want this season to be; and as joyful as it should be; let us not forget that Jesus was born into the world so that we may have eternal joy as a result of his unimaginable suffering. If we don't leave Advent prematurely, the joy of Christmas will fill our hearts in ways we might not expect.
