GOSPEL Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance.

CLERGY REFLECTION

As I stated last weekend, we find ourselves celebrating back-to-back feast days which have much significance regarding our understanding of God's plan of redemption for the human race. Yesterday we celebrated Mary the Mother of God (not a Holy Day of Obligation this year) and today we celebrate Epiphany, that universal recognition of Christ's disclosure outside the periphery of Israel. How can we connect these two important mysteries of our faith? Perhaps some history is needed. The title "Mother of God" is a western derivation from the Greek "Theotokos", which means "God-bearer." Mary being chosen by God the Father to bring Jesus Christ into this world and her willingness to do so is great cause for celebration. Without her "yes" to the angel, there is no Incarnation. To put it into a syllogism: Jesus is the Son of Mary. Jesus is God. Therefore, Mary is the Mother of God. The honoring of Mary as the Mother of God can be traced back to the Council of Ephesus in 431. By the 7th century, January 1st was observed as a celebration of the "Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary." Today we know the feast as the "Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God." The story of the "Adoration of the Wise Men" (Epiphany) is one of the best known in the life of the Lord. However, the episode recounted by the Evangelist Matthew is not primarily an exact historical account. Rather, the focus of interest is the content, which concerns the history of salvation in the message passed on by this witness of faith. This is why the story of the Three Kings has become a favorite subject in the theological expressions of art. The star that guided the Magi has become an example of the Gospel proclamation to all, thus the title of the feast as "Epiphany," meaning "manifestation." The connection is obvious. God came into the world through a woman, and He came on behalf of everyone. May Jesus not only continue to be born in our hearts daily, but may His presence manifested in our actions and words give witness to the world of our faith in His saving grace.


