FIRST READING

Isaiah 62:1-5

As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.

To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.



PREPARATION OF THE ALTAR AND GIFTS

(Sung first by cantor, then congregation repeat)



God has called us through the Gospel to possess the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. R.

GOSPEL John 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine."

And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."

His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons.

Jesus told the them, "Fill the jars with water."

So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them,

"Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter."

So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew — the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him,

"Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.


Next Day of Recollection: 'Freedom to Fail' January 18

CLERGY REFLECTION

Christmas weekend was busy, to say the least. Kudos and thanks to all who made our liturgies spectacular and efficient, especially our choirs and cantors, ministers of the word and Eucharist, servers, greeters, but especially our usher corps, who made sure all the Masses were covered from Christmas Eve to the last Sunday Mass the day after Christmas. If not for the help of our dedicated volunteers and ministers we would be hard pressed to make the high solemnities at the Cathedral so successful and reverent.

On another note: In the November issue of the "Bishop's Bulletin," Bishop DeGrood penned his letter to the faithful on the upcoming Church Synod announced by Pope Francis slated for some time in 2023. With the beginning of the new year, every parish in the diocese has been asked to pray for the success of the 2023 Synod process using a prayer put together by the Diocesan Synod Planning committee. The prayer will be found in the parish bulletin during the course of the year and we will pray it together on Sundays before the final blessing during the Masses. But you can also pray it as a part of your daily prayer too. This "Prayer to the Holy Spirit," was prayed at the beginning of all the sessions of Vatican Council II. The planning phase during the year 2022 will call upon parishes to have a broad conversation about: 1.The Church. 2.What it means to "announce" the Gospel as Catholics. 3. How do we journey together as a universal Church. 4. How does the Holy Spirit invite us to grow as Catholics with a common mission. I refer you to Bishop DeGrood's broader description of the above in the November "Bishop's Bulletin" (www.sfcatholic.org/bishopsbulletin/category/ bishop-degrood/). The question to ask ourselves, is how can we benefit more from our Catholic faith and help others benefit from the faith given the times that we live in? We have planned two public forums for our parish after the 4p.m Mass on Saturday February 19, and after the 11am Mass on Sunday February 20. There will be more details to follow. For the time being ... let us pray.


