



CLERGY REFLECTION

Blessed are the Comfortable?

Is the above motto the vision you live by? It is easy to fall into the mindset that when I'm comfortable, life is good. In today's Gospel, Luke chapter 6, Jesus "raising his eyes toward his disciples" teaches them a vision of life that is contrary to comfort being the driving force. Let's remember that He looks at us and teaches us as He taught His 1st century disciples the same message:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man."

He just taught us that we are blessed to be poor, to be hungry, to weep and to be hated and insulted. This is not the usual list of what we think of when we define being blessed. Why would Jesus define blessedness/happiness in this way? When we are physically and spiritually hungry there is an invitation to turn to Him in our need. When we are weeping and experiencing grief there is an invitation to experience grief and sadness with Him. When we are insulted and even hated by others we are invited to know Christ with us as He also experienced in His earthly life hatred and rejection. This interior shift in mind and heart is necessary to be able to persevere in running the race of faith until our last breath. Learning to "rejoice and leap for joy on that day!" when we experience such trials is only possible by living in God's grace daily. We begin to see and accept that our true and full comfort will come from eternal life in Heaven as Jesus teaches, "Behold, your reward will be great in heaven." As He challenges the vision we have for our lives and for what it means to be blessed and happy He cautions why it is dangerous to let comfort be our life's principle.

Finding our comfort and happiness in Jesus Christ is a daily decision. Life throws many challenges at us and only in Christ can we see there is a purpose and value in those suffering. Jesus, thank you for the challenge and invitation to let our vision of life be inspired and formed by Your vision for our lives.
