THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

1 Sm 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

In those days, Saul went down to the desert of Ziph with three thousand picked men of Israel, to search for David in the desert of Ziph. So David and Abishai went among Saul's soldiers by night and found Saul lying asleep within the barricade, with his spear thrust into the ground at his head and Abner and his men sleeping around him. Abishai whispered to David: "God has delivered your enemy into your grasp this day. Let me nail him to the ground with one thrust of the spear; I will not need a second thrust!" But David said to Abishai, "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the LORD's anointed and remain unpunished?" So David took the spear and the water jug from their place at Saul's head, and they got away without anyone's seeing or knowing or awakening. All remained asleep, because the LORD had put them into a deep slumber. Going across to an opposite slope, David stood on a remote hilltop at a great distance from Abner, son of Ner, and the troops. 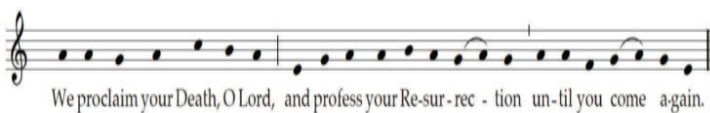

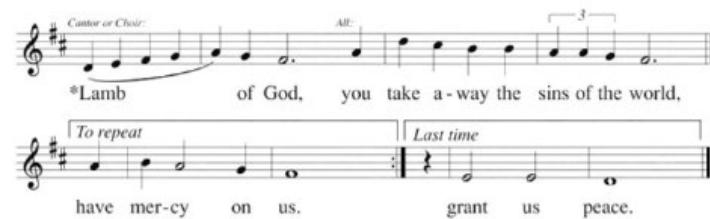

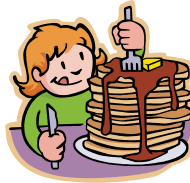

CLERGY REFLECTION

In our Gospel for this Sunday Jesus tells us we are to love our enemies and turn the other cheek. That's hard to do when you're Irish. Just kidding. While a seminarian in Rome, I spent Holy Week in London as a part of our Easter vacation. There, we went to one of the theatres near Piccadilly Circus and took in the classical musical, *Les Miserables*. The protagonist, Jean Valjean, is released from prison after spending 19 years behind bars for stealing bread to feed his sister's children. No one, upon his release, will sell him food or shelter because of his criminal record. Hopeless and exhausted, he stumbles into the house of a saintly bishop, who greets him courteously as an honored guest and offers him the best hospitality at his disposal. Valjean, bewildered by the bishop's kindness, but desperate to survive, flees in the middle of the night, taking with him the silver plates from the bishop's table. In the morning, the bishop is troubled not by the abuse of hospitality, not by the treachery and theft, but by his own lack of charity: "I have for a long time wrongfully withheld this silver," he says to himself, "it belonged to the poor. Who was this man? A poor man evidently." When the police arrive with the captured Valjean, the bishop's silver in his possession, the bishop calmly greets the thief and says, "But I gave you the candlesticks also (wink, wink), which match the plates...you forgot them when you left." Since the bishop insisted no theft had occurred, the police release Valjean. The thief just stands there confused. "Jean Valjean," says the bishop, "you no longer belong to evil, but to good. It is your soul that I am restoring." Valjean is forever grateful for the bishop's act of kindness. In the midst of a mean-spirited world, we are too easily prone to overreact and feel the victim. Retribution is generally the order of the day when we are wronged. Jesus calls us to react differently. Don't kill your enemy with vengeance; kill them with kindness. It has eternal implications...for us and them.


