

CLERGY REFLECTION

As we watch with shock and horror at the events playing out in Ukraine, we cannot help but feel pity for the Ukrainian people, especially suffering civilians – and anger at the leader of Russia for his hubris and total disregard for human life. Though we are so far away from it all, it is still terrifying and disturbing. Life, which seemed so normal just a few weeks ago, is now tottering on the unthinkable.

To make a correlation in the context of our faith, this is the reality of Christ's passion and death. One minute they are welcoming Him into Jerusalem as the Messiah; the next, they are marching Him off for crucifixion. Think of Jesus' Mother and His disciples who couldn't comprehend or bear what was happening before their eyes. Shortly before, they were celebrating and singing during the course of the Passover Meal. But in a moment, everything changed. The complete and utter bewilderment they experienced at the madness and insanity of an unpredictable event.

The movie *The Passion of the Christ* vividly depicts the insanity and savagery so well, and the bewilderment. I remember an edition of the *Children's Stations of the Cross* which I prayed at Holy Spirit Parish for school stations that had a line that went something like this in regards to the brutality of the soldiers and the watching crowds: "...it was like the whole world had gone crazy..."

It did that day, 2000 years ago. And it's pretty crazy right now. So we shouldn't be surprised that evil can rear its ugly head so quickly and violently. We must keep our heads about us, and our eyes fixed on Christ. What is happening in Ukraine is a lens into the vivid imagery we embrace as we follow Jesus to Calvary every Lent.


