THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41

When the captain and the court officers had brought the apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name? Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and want to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles said in reply, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our ancestors raised Jesus, though you had him killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins. We are witnesses of these things, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles to stop speaking in the name of Jesus, and dismissed them. So they left the presence of the Sanhedrin, rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name.

At that time, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to Simon Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." Jesus said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me."

Catholic Burial—St. Michael’s Cemetery, (605) 338-3376

It was a difficult decision to make, but one that I felt that I had to make. Fr. Fitzpatrick’s mother had passed away and no one from the Diocese was attending the funeral to give him fraternal support. Not that they didn’t want to be there to give him and his family support, but Fr. Fitzpatrick (Cathedral Rector-Emeritus) lives outside of Philadelphia. That’s a long trip. Plus, the funeral was on a Saturday, and that’s a tough time for any priest to get away from the parish. So on Thursday night, after receiving assurances from Fr. Norfolk and Fr. Thuringer that the parish would be covered; and after receiving the Bishop’s blessing to represent him at the funeral, I made the decision to go. I would miss First Holy Communion at the Cathedral Parish because of it. I have never missed a First Communion as a pastor. It was painful not to be there and not to be able to give our First Communicants “Jesus in the Eucharist” for the very first time. However, the Lord always brings about His plan. Father and his family were extremely grateful for my presence. They were particularly touched by my words of condolences on behalf of the Bishop, our priests, the Diocese and the Cathedral Parish. The funeral was beautiful. Fr. Fitzpatrick delivered an inspiring homily about his mother and her faith, and the effect that it had on him, his father, his siblings, and his nieces and nephews. The private burial on Monday morning was emotional. She is buried in the largest Irish cemetery I have ever seen in my life. It’s like a city. You could get lost amid the Celtic crosses. And I was there, with my brother priest, whose mother surrendered him to us as a “Son of the Church of Sioux Falls” short of 20 years ago. I was there offering my support and prayers. It was the right decision to make. Please forgive me for my absence on one of the most important weekends of celebration in the parish. You have to know that priests love their mothers. Priests have a special relationship with their moms. Perhaps, it’s because moms have always been the strongest advocates of our priestly vocation. Or maybe there is the image we have of the Blessed Virgin Mary as mother. We go to her as priests, much like we went to our mothers for protection, care and self-assurance. And don’t be fooled – our mothers still tell us what to do, even as priests – just as much as they did when we were growing up. Today is the Feast of St. Joseph. You are probably wondering why I am not writing about him. It’s okay. He would understand. He had a mother too, and I’m sure she had something to do with his “decision” to stick with Mary all the way to Bethlehem and beyond. All in God’s wonderful, yet bemusing plan. Here’s to St. Joseph...and his mother!
