THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

#### FIRST READING

Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God. On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, "I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord. All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region. The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.



Today is the fourth Sunday of Easter which means we are approaching the half-way mark of the Easter season. That's right, Easter is not just a day, it is a season. In fact the season stretches from Easter Sunday all the way to Pentecost which is fifty days. It is interesting that the Easter season is actually longer than the season of Lent which is the season to examine our lives and to prepare for the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. As Catholics, what are we to make of this?

During Lent we strive to introduce a greater degree of discipline into our spiritual life. Maybe it involves what we eat, what we watch, how we pray or just generally how we spend our free time. Hopefully whatever we chose to do differently during Lent was successful in changing our lives in some way. This is not a time to backslide into our pre-Lenten ways but, rather, to draw closer to God by actively incorporating those Lenten acts of self-discipline into our daily lives.

During this season we are hearing many stories involving the Risen Christ and the Apostles activities following the Resurrection. Christ was anything but passive during this time period. The Acts of the Apostles tells us of many appearances of Christ to various sub-groups of the Apostles, all the Apostles together, other small groups of people and even one group of five hundred people. Then after he ascended back to his Father, he sent the Holy Spirit to give the rather passive, and very cautious apostles, the courage to place their lives on the line for the One who gave everything for them (and us).

We are not in a season to be cautious or passive. This is not the time to go back to our old ways. We don't have to wait until Pentecost for the Holy Spirit to come down upon us and inspire and motivate us to dedicate our lives to Christ. The Holy Spirit is here for us at all times. All we need do is ask for His help and be open to what our heart is telling us we are called to do, and who we are called to be.

Come Holy Spirit. Guide us to hear how Jesus is inviting us to follow him so that we may actively strive to know, and to do, the Father's will.
