



CLERGY REFLECTION

For many, the *Christmas at Cathedral* concert at the Cathedral is the beginning of their Christmas. At the least, it prompts them to continue their Advent journey with anticipation for the celebrations to come.

The Catholic Community Foundation of Eastern South Dakota takes on the momentous task of hosting the event – now in its 26th year. A shout out to Mark Conzemius and Jan Feterl and their staff for the impeccable job they do in presenting a professional production that involves countless hours of preparation and planning.

It also involves countless volunteers (including many of our parishioners) who work around the clock, and without exception, the tireless effort of the Cathedral maintenance crew. A shout out to Terry McMahon, Juan Carlos Rivera and Arlen Boso.

We can't forget that the Concert benefits the maintenance and upkeep of the Cathedral, as well as helping the Bishop Dudley House.

One of the highlights for me was the cello solo of Caccini's *Ave Maria*. Most of us are familiar with Schubert's version from weddings or funerals. Caccini's arrangement is haunting. Mary's submissive joy in the song is palpable, but also palpable in the rhythm and movement of the song is Mary's pensive reflection. She already knows the destiny of her Son. ... *And Mary kept all these things and pondered them in her heart* (Lk 2:19). The arrangement sweeps you away into the depth of the *Angelical Salutation*, or the prayer we call, *the Hail Mary*:

Hail Mary...Rejoice! Be glad! There is an amazing message coming to you from the Divine! Full of Grace...You are favored in a unique way by God! The Lord of all life is with you! The grace that fills your being has kept you sinless! Mother of God...You will bear a son who is both human and divine! Because you are the mother of Jesus, you are the Mother of God! You are the mother and model for the Church! Pray for us sinners...We are in need of your intercession for the sake of our redemption! Not only when we face the mystery of death, but in our everyday life as we struggle to be free from sin and faithful disciples of the Lord! Our pilgrimage is long and difficult, without your help, your intercession we may fail!

Mary was obedient to the word she heard from God; Mary was responsive in her active concern for all she encountered and endured; Mary's obedience and self-giving mirrors our Eucharistic celebration on this Solemnity.

Today, on this her feast day as *Theotokos*, Mother of God, we ask for her intercession for the holiness of the world, the holiness of our nation and the holiness of our families. Blessed are you, Mary, for saying "yes" to the angel, yes to God!
