Please, <u>do not</u> take pictures during the Mass celebration. You are welcome to take pictures <u>after</u> Mass.







#### CLERGY REFLECTION

The theme of "salt and light" appears again as we celebrate St. Josephine Bakhita whose feast day is on February 08 and it has become international day for prayer and reflection on human trafficking. The power of the Spirit working in us and through us is meant to touch others' lives with God's loving concern and mercy. Through the intercession of St. Josephine Bakhita we are seeing that many great things are happening in the world.

Pope Francis is now in South Sudan from February 3-5. He has not been working and praying for nothing. South Sudan has been named as the preferable model of religious diversity and tolerance between religious communities in Sub-Saharan Africa.

The Islamic Council of South Sudan was selected to share its experience on religious coexistence and tolerance between different communities, cultures and denominations in the country. "Southern Sudan has won the honor of choosing the best country in Africa, south of the Sahara, as a model for peaceful coexistence between religions," he told Eye Radio.

Everyone believes that the state of South Sudan would witness religious persecution because of the suffering of the southerners in Sudan from the Muslim regimes in Sudan, but the religious communities in South Sudan reflect the spirit of tolerance and brotherhood among them. The Vatican Charge De' Affaires in Juba is urging South Sudanese to forgive one another and reconcile ahead of Pope Francis' planned visit. Monsignor Ionut Paul is also appealing for unity among the people of South Sudan. He encourages the citizens to build peace in the communities, saying this is the only way to bring stability to the country. "We have to prepare that the message of the Holy Father reaches us, and this is very important as we only have two weeks left to prepare ourselves for his coming, in a spiritual way," Paul said in an interview with Eye Radio. "Making peace in our family, making peace with our neighbors, making peace with the people around us, because only through people of peace, peace will come to this country and the blessing of the Holy Father Pope Francis and the blessing of the Archbishop of Canterbury and the moderator of the Church of Scotland will reach us truly." "So I encourage you all to prepare spiritually for his coming, for the coming of the three religious leaders, making peace and reconciliation so that the message and the blessing can reach all of us, each one of us and all of us as a country."

Pope Francis drew attention to the scourge of human trafficking on Saint Bakhita's feast day and called upon government leaders worldwide to intervene and stop the trafficking of persons. The Pope prayed to Saint Bakhita and asked that she intercede and assist trafficking victims. We also pray for the peace of the world. **St. Josephine**
