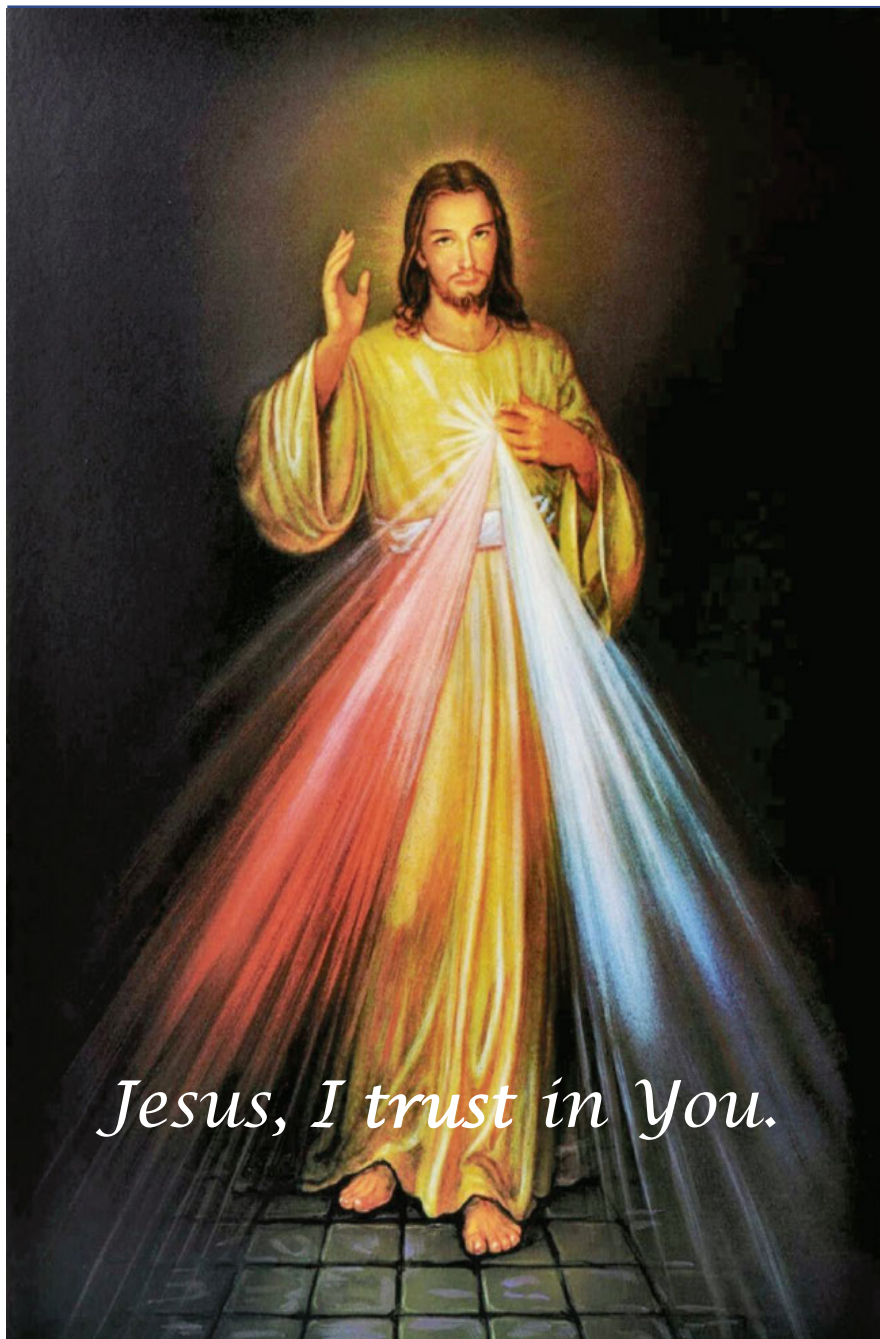

Step 1 - Using a regular set of Rosary beads, you begin by making the sign of the cross.

(Optional Opening Prayer) You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat three times) O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!

Step 2 - On the three beads of the rosary pray the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Apostles Creed.

Step 3 - You begin each decade with the Our Father beads by praying this prayer: Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

Step 4 - Complete the decade on the 10 Hail Mary beads by praying this prayer: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Repeat Steps 3 and 4 for each decade on the rosary beads

Step 5 - Once you have prayed all 5 decades, you finish the Chaplet by praying the following prayer 3 times: Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

(Optional Closing Prayer) Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us, and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments, we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. **Amen**

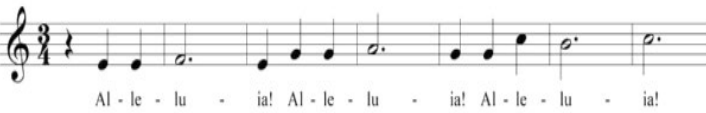
SECOND READING 1 Peter 1:3-9

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, “Peace be with you.” When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.”

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, “We have seen the Lord.” But he said to them, “Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.” Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, “Peace be with you.” Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here and see my

hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.” Thomas answered and said to him, “My Lord and my God!” Jesus said to him, “Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.”

Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

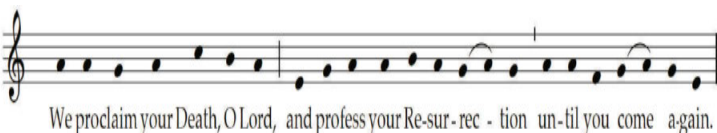

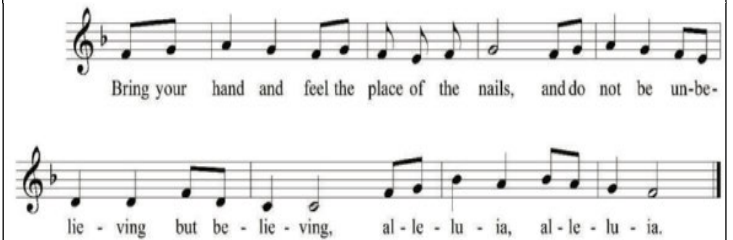

CLERGY REFLECTION

I know you are curious about the old rectory construction. From appearances, a lot more “DEstruction” looks to be happening rather than “CONstruction.” It is quite obvious that the roof is being replaced. The white paper-like covering is actually the waterproofing mat. It’s almost ready for the new tile to be fitted into place. So, yes, it’s a new roof. This was a problem that needed immediate attention because of its deterioration. The interior demolition is almost complete. This will continue as space within the rectory is designed and converted. As you might imagine, the wiring, plumbing, HVAC and mechanical, all need to be replaced (none of it is functional). So, what’s with the flat-roofed building on the east side, are we demolishing this part of the rectory? The answer is, “No.” The limestone has been stripped away (the brick and windows are next) to make way for an addition to that building. This building will be extended to the east to provide for a two-stall garage. The windows and limestone will be replaced on the front and the side of the addition in order to keep the historic look intact. When will you get to see the plans? Soon. We are planning public meetings to coincide with the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker, our Patronal Feast Day. But first, some history: You may recall that the parish owns the historic rectory (what used to be the Adoration Sisters temporary monastery). The Diocese owns the Carriage House where the priests currently reside. This tradeoff occurred in 2002 through the kindness and benevolence of the Cathedral Parish. Bishop Carlson asked the parish to come to the aid of the Sisters by having them occupy the old rectory as the priests moved to the Carriage House as it is known. Both the Diocese and the Parish wanted to ensure that the Sisters had a temporary place to call “home.” It was assumed that one day the priests would move back into the original, historic rectory. So here we are. As I have mentioned previously, the Rectory Restoration is part of a much larger campaign that includes a new Cathedral Organ of European quality; a Sacred Music and Liturgy Endowment to maintain quality sacred music at the Cathedral and preserve the new organ; funds needed to furnish the rectory and provide for its upkeep; and a landscaping project for the rectory grounds. We will announce the progress of the construction project, along with the progress of the design and building of the new Cathedral Organ after all the Masses on Sunday April 30.
