



Jesus said:

"Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.

When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."







# CLERGY REFLECTION

The Holy Communion is an act of worship we engage in every Sunday. It is also known as the Lord's Supper as well as the Eucharist. A term with its roots in the Greek 'eucharisto' which means "giving of thanks". Though it's a seemingly simple act where Christians break bread and drink from the cup, Holy Communion is an important act. Therefore we should seek to understand (especially if you are new to the faith) why we do it because otherwise, our participation becomes meaningless, displeasing to God and detrimental to us also. So in today's sermon, I am going to address three important truths that all of us should be aware of. (Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-33).

**1.** The Message of the Holy Communion is that a new covenant was established when Jesus shed his blood on the cross of Calvary, (1 Cor. 11:25).

2. The Purpose of the Holy Communion is; to remember his sufferings and death as it was mandated by Christ himself, (1 Cor. 11:23-25), To proclaim our faith in the efficiency of his death, (1 Corinthians 11:26a) and in his return, (1 Cor. 11:26b) and To fellowship in the body of Christ in the sense of reinforcing fellowship among each other in the church, (1 Cor. 11:33). 3. The Order of the Holy Communion; Must not take part in a manner unworthy of Christ's sufferings. Implies sin not repented for and irreverent attitudes, (1 Corinthians 11:27), each one should put himself to test as to the attitude of his heart, outward conduct, and understanding of the true nature and purpose of Communion, (1 Cor. 11:28), because those who don't participate in a worthy manner are guilty of re-crucifying Christ. They risk illness and even physical death, (1 Cor. 11:29-30) and if we judge ourselves before participating, however, the Lord shall not judge us eternally with the world but discipline us, (1 Cor. 11:31-33).

On 23rd April 2023 St. Joseph Cathedral kids from traditional class and St. Josephine Bakhita First Communion class, about 30 candidates received First Communion. There was an unexpected crowd at 11:00 Mass. The Gospel of that Sunday was about two disciples recognizing Jesus in the breaking of the bread. The best homily was preached by the rector of St. Joseph Cathedral, Fr. James Morgan and he asked the kids saying "after two disciples recognize Jesus, He vanished from their sight. Where did Jesus go?" and the kids answered "He entered into the bread". It was a wonderful Eucharistic celebration.

Some communities celebrated with their kids together in the school gym immediately after Mass until the 4:00 PM Mass.

Dear parents, tell your child how proud of him/her you are on the day of their First Communion. Include specific examples of how they have made you proud, such as how hard they studied in class. Most churches hold a series of classes to prepare the children for their First Communion. We too held classes for both St. Josephine Bakhita and St. Joseph First Communion classes this year of 2023. Dear parents; tell your children that they surprised you with their rapid progression and eagerness to partake in the ceremony. Tell your child how this makes you feel, spiritually and emotionally. Tell your kids that you also pray that they become increasingly closer to Jesus and have a continual desire to please him in everything they do. Your prayer may be more specific.
