THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING







CATHEDRAL MUSIC - According to the Second Vatican Council, "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art." The Church calls for this treasure to be "preserved and fostered with great care," especially in Cathedral churches. The Cathedral of Saint Joseph follows this call, by maintaining active choirs: children, adult and the men's schola choirs, as well as a team of dedicated cantors. We are host to many concerts throughout the year along with the numerous weddings, funerals and



diocesan events. Supporting all of these efforts is the pipe organ, an instrument which leads congregational singing, accompanies choirs and cantors, and provides for the musical needs at the Cathedral. The pipe organ is integral to the Cathedral's mission of preserving and fostering the Church's musical tradition.

ORGAN PROJECT HISTORY AND VISION - In 2012, faced with clear signs of deterioration in the Cathedral pipe organ, Dr. Jared Ostermann, Cathedral's Music Director, along with organ experts began a multi-year process of investigation and assessment into the history, repair and refurbishment options for our current organ. Eventually, Fr. Morgan, in consultation with various parish councils, reached a decision to have a new instrument custom built for Cathedral of St. Joseph. Research into world class organ builders began with the organ committee visiting organs built by the two top finalists. The organ committee along with Fr. Morgan and Jared chose


Juget-Sinclair Organ Builders from Montreal, Quebec, Canada to build Cathedral's new pipe organ.

The organ will be built using the same techniques and

The organ will be built using the same techniques and traditions that produced the great historical instruments of

Europe – organs that are still robust after centuries of use! But just as important, the new instrument will be beautiful; an organ that truly matches the visual and acoustical aesthetic of the Cathedral.

In this way, our generation's efforts to preserve and foster the treasure of sacred music will continue to bear fruit far into the future.
