



PENITENTIAL ACT

FIRST READING

Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen.

He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

And he put all things beneath his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way.





The Rectory - Part 1: The Why

The history of the Cathedral rectory is directly tied to the building of the Cathedral itself. Both architects of the Cathedral – Masqueray and Lundie – had the rectory design in their sketches of the Cathedral project. The old parish home located on the north side of the



Cathedral was demolished in 1918. The current rectory was built sometime between 1919 and 1922. The two flat roof additions were built in the 1940s. In describing the plans for the new Cathedral, Lundie wrote in 1918: "The parish house (current rectory) provides the office and living apartments for the pastor and assistants, and is tied with the balance of the



Cathedral by means of cloisters...The parish house (current rectory) and sacristies add to the Cathedral a picturesque note." It's this sense of history and beauty that compels us as a parish to carry on the historical legacy of the Cathedral project: to

honor the faithful parishioners before us who worked hard to provide for it. However, to do so out of nostalgia is impractical. The restoration of the rectory must have a realistic objective. When I arrived, I was surprised to find many priests (ours and others) who were in town for various reasons calling and asking for a place to stay. It's the Cathedral, why not? Certainly not my idea exclusively, but bouncing it off others decided that once the historic rectory was restored, it would become a "house of hospitality" for priests, that is, a place where a priest could spend a night or two when in Sioux Falls. It would provide for greater fraternity and bonding for priests, even though our schedules

have us coming and going. At the core of this, however, is that the Cathedral priests would be back where they belong, living and praying in the building intended for them. More to come on the rectory; stay tuned. - Fr. James Morgan
