Please, <u>do not</u> take pictures during the Mass celebration. You are welcome to take pictures <u>after</u> Mass.







CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The Rectory – Part II: The Restoration

As presented to parishioners during the *InSpires* presentations, the work on the rectory will be quite extensive. When you consider the building is 100 years old, it's not an exaggeration to say that everything needs to be replaced. There are big-ticket items, like the roof, which is currently being meticulously



replaced. There is also the complete replacement of the mechanical/HVAC, and wiring and plumbing. So, in essence, the whole infrastructure must be replaced. One of the challenges from the beginning was finding a space for the garage. Fortunately, the connected flat-roof building on the



east side will be able to serve that purpose. The brick portion of the building has been demolished with the exception of the back wall. The limestone was carefully removed, and will be reused on the exterior of the garage in order to maintain the consistent, historical look with the rest of the rectory and

Cathedral. Most of the rooms from the old rectory will retain their historic function, for example, the dining room, the kitchen, the sitting room, and all the bedrooms on second and third floors. All will be restored or remodeled. One

addition on the first floor is a chapel in the northwest quarter. Priests need a place for quiet, undisturbed contemplative prayer, and a place to say Mass on their day off. There will be six bedrooms in all: three on second floor – three suites for resident priests, including a handicap accessible bedroom;



and three on third floor for visiting priests, bishops or seminarians. Yes, with this design, there is need for a "residential elevator." When will the restoration/remodel be completed? By the grace of God, and everyone's generosity, by July of 2024. Please, pray for the success of the *InSpires* Campaign! Come, Holy Spirit! *Fr. James Morgan*
