Music and Liturgy Endowment - We are in the midst of the Cathedral Judgues Capital Campaign, and by this time you have probably heard or read a good deal about the rectory and the pipe organ. The third major element of the campaign is the expansion of the music program, through the hiring of an Assistant Music Director, and the building of an endowment to sustain this growth for years to come. While an assistant will help me with liturgical playing and choral accompanying, the main focus of the new position will be



building our children's music program. To build children's music in a well-organized, sustainable way, we need a musician who can focus on this area full-time, and bring expertise in children's pedagogical methods to our parish. It sounds a bit cliché to say "the children are our future," but this is certainly true! We need to train children as musicians, so that in the years to come they will have the skills to contribute and lead as cantors, choir members, and organists here or in their own parishes. This is critical to our local parish, to our diocese, and to the wider church. I also like to point out that "the children are our present!" Over the years we've had children as young as 14 in the Cathedral Choir, and other teenagers serving as cantors and instrumentalists. You may not know it, but we've even had talented teenagers play the organ several times when we needed a substitute! And you may have already heard our children's choir singing at Mass at the Cathedral. Well-trained and skilled children start to contribute much sooner than most people think, and as the program grows, you will continue to see young musicians playing a much greater role, either in their own choirs, or with our adult choirs or as organists and instrumentalists. Over the next two years, you will be able to watch the rectory and then the pipe organ as they are built. These are physical, architectural achievements that will be obvious to you and to anyone visiting the Cathedral. But maybe even more exciting than either of those things, and more hidden from view, will be the growth of our children's musical offerings, as we begin to train the next generation of liturgical musicians here at the cathedral.
