

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Deuteronomy 8:2-3,14b-16a

Moses said to the people:





In Spires Capital Campaign Endowments -

Eleven inches of rain and the roof is leaking — it's -20° and the furnace needs to be replaced —the car no longer can be fixed and we need to replace it. What do you do if you have one of these unfortunate experiences? Hopefully you have an emergency fund or savings account to draw from. For the Cathedral of St. Joseph, a non-profit entity, this fund is called an endowment.

Many sacrifices have been made by those who have gone before us for the house of worship that is ours. Sacrificial gifts to restore our Cathedral have been made, and now is our time to establish an endowment fund for liturgy, music and the rectory.

Liturgy is the nuts and bolts of our Catholic faith. Sacrifice and praise demand the best offering we can make to bring all of us closer to the Lord. Liturgy at the Cathedral should be a model for other parishes in the diocese. Some items that would fall under this category are altar breads, vestments, candles, cleaning and replacement of vessels used at various liturgies, and environment for liturgical seasons, to name a few.

Music is the highest form of sacred art. Our new organ completes the artistic and liturgical restoration of the Cathedral, sustains the art of praising God which is of immeasurable value, and extends the preaching of the Gospel. The endowment can support the need for an Assistant Music Director, inspire a love for sacred liturgy for our youth, and expand our music library. Also, at some point the St. Michael hymnals will need to be replaced. The organ is similar to a car that needs periodic maintenance to preserve the majestic organ it will be.

The endowment for the rectory is like our home that needs constant upkeep and repairs.

So how does an endowment work? Donations are made to the endowment, funds are invested in perpetuity, and annual distributions are made to the Cathedral to finance a portion of the operating or capital needs of the liturgy, music or rectory. It is an important source of revenue. It is also a hedge against inflation because each year the distribution should increase.

Thank you to parishioners who have made a sacrificial gift to the InSpires Campaign. Please continue to pray for the success of the campaign and how you might support this important endeavor – all to give honor and praise to God.
