


Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus:



GOSPEL

Matthew 9:36-10:8

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.

Then he said to his disciples,

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness.

The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."





CLERGY REFLECTION

To know what is happening within our parish about St. Josephine Bakhita Ecclesial Communities is that we have installed Small Christian Communities (SCCs) successfully in the families in the different groups.

The "Church as the Family of God Model" is a new ecclesial option that focuses on building families and building SCCs that are involved in reconciliation, justice and peace in the Catholic Church and in the wider society. It was during the first synod for Africa that the small Christian communities came to be suggested as a new way of being church in Africa. The Bishops came back, again and again to the SCCs as the way of being Church, which means that we must divide our parishes and our communities into small groups where people can come together and share their lives together and read the Gospels together and ask themselves together about the will of Jesus to their lives. And so everyone can deepen his Christian faith. The bishops made it clear that together as community the people can join what they believe to what they live in the SCC. Within it, they can become active and participate in the life of the Church because they develop new ministries, lay ministries, and ministry of catechesis, ministry of reconciliation, ministry to marriages, and ministry to healing, ministry to the poor, ministry of justice within the Christian community and outside it.

A SCC is a small neighborhood, parish based group in the church, named under patronage of the saint to guard, protect and lead by their patron saint in awareness of the pastor and that is pastoral model of church that transforms the parish into a communion of communities and instrument of evangelization. This is a group of 12-15 families or more, that if there is a need, meet weekly in the church and once in their homes to reflect on the bible especially the Gospel of the following Sunday, and connect it to their daily lives. A SCC is a caring, sharing, faith reflecting, praying and serving community in Christian families. It is a community which engages in evangelizing its members so that subsequently they can bring the Good News to others; pray and listen to God's Word; encourage its members to take on responsibility, learn to live the ecclesial life; and reflect on different human problems in the light of the Gospel. So far we have: St. Mary SCC, St. Anthony of Padua SCC, Blessed Anna Rosa Gattorno SCC, St. Joseph SCC, St. Daniel Comboni SCC, Our Lady Perpetual Help SCC, St. Mother Theresa SCC, and St. Padre Pio SCC. We are creating more SCCs to help us in our ministry and to reach out to our Catholic families. This model of "being church" as a family can even help with the Set Ablaze pastoral planning at a pastorate level, not just the parish level.
