

Please, <u>do not</u> take pictures during the Mass celebration. You are welcome to take pictures <u>after</u> Mass.



PENITENTIAL ACT

Brothers and sisters:

But death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those who did not sin after the pattern of the trespass of Adam, who is the type of the one who was to come.

But the gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many.

Jesus said to the Twelve:

And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna.

Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

I believe in one God. the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



CLERGY REFLECTION

Have you ever been persecuted for living out your Catholic faith? No matter how little or great the persecution, if you are living a life in accord with the teachings of Christ and His Church, you have experienced some form of persecution. We understand that as disciples of Jesus we will experience to some degree, the same treatment for living out the gospel that He and his Apostles did. Not only do we read about the fate of Jesus' followers in the gospel this week but also how the prophet Jeremiah is facing severe persecution for proclaiming God's word to the Israelites. One need only listen to or read Catholic news media to hear of the persecution taking place against the Church and those who live out their Catholic faith.

Maybe there are some who are not experiencing push back or rejection for following Jesus. However we can be sure that as the world around us falls further away from the truth, it will more aggressively oppose those living the truth. So the question becomes; how do we respond to this force of darkness?

We would do well to heed the words of Jesus in today's gospel when he tells the Apostles to fear no one. Fear can be a great hindrance to living out a life of discipleship. In my own life I have had to overcome a tremendous amount of fear to become a follower of Christ and even more so in being ordained a deacon. Jesus tells his Apostles three times in the seven short gospel verses not to be afraid. Most would agree that not being afraid is something easier said then done. Imagine the twelve Apostles when Jesus tells them "do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul." If I would have been in their sandals I wouldn't have found Jesus' words very comforting. So what caused the Apostles to sacrifice their lives to follow Jesus? What was the reason that so many Christians were martyred in the early Church? To this day people are severely persecuted and killed for proclaiming their faith in Christ. The only explanation that makes sense to me is love. 1 John 4:18-19 states that perfect love drives out fear and we love because He first loved us. Each person's faith and love for God is a unique gift. To overcome persecution our love for God and his Church must be stronger then love of self. Jesus tells us in Luke Chapter 21:17-18, "You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish." God loves us so much that He will not allow a single hair to perish and He has counted them all.
