



#### **PENITENTIAL ACT**

#### FIRST READING

2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there." Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.






# Prayer for Vocations

# CLERGY REFLECTION

Lately, I have found myself dealing with a series of crises in my life – personal and pastoral. My usual "go-to" prayer is the "Surrender Novena" by Don Dolindo. However, there is another devotion that is just as powerful and underrated: Mary the Mother of Jesus as "Untier of Knots" or "Undoer of Knots." The first reference to Our Lady as Untier of Knots is attributed to St. Irenaeus (201-310 AD), Bishop and Martyr. In his ancient text *Against Heresies* he wrote: "The knot of Eve's disobedience was loosed by Mary's obedience. For what the virgin Eve had bound fast through unbelief, this did the virgin Mary set free through faith." These "figurative knots" of disobedience and sin are undone by Mary in heaven. Mary was given the task to participate in Christ's redemptive action, allowing us to ask for her intercession.

For centuries, devotion to Mary under this title "Untier of Knots" was localized to Germany. The devotion gained attention in 1612, when a married couple of German nobility decided to divorce. To save their marriage, the couple decided to seek the counsel of Father Jakob Rem, a Jesuit priest. It was believed that Father Rem had been experiencing apparitions of Mary in prayer. On the day of their last visit together, September 28, 1615, Father Rem had been praying in the chapel of the monastery before an image of the Virgin Mary. When the two men met, the husband gave his wedding ribbon to Father Rem. (In the marriage ceremony of that time and place, the maid of honor joined together the arms of the bride and groom with a ribbon in order to represent their invisible union for the rest of their lives.) In a solemn ritual act, Father Rem took the wedding ribbon from the husband and lifted it up, while at the same time untying the knots of the ribbon one by one. As Father Rem smoothed out the ribbon, it became intensely white. Because of this happening, the couple were able to avoid a divorce and continue their marriage. Some years later, a painter, Johann Melchior Georg Schmittdner, was commissioned to provide a painting for the family altar. He decided to base his painting on the story of Father Rem and the wedding ribbon. Schmittdner depicts the Virgin Mary as she is untying the knots of the ribbon of married life. Angels assist the Blessed Mother; one presents the knots of our lives to her, while another angel presents a ribbon, freed from knots, to us.

The devotion to "Mary, Untier of Knots" was not well known until recently. In the 1980's it was brought to Argentina by Archbishop Jorge Mario Bergoglio, S.J. (now Pope Francis), where it remains particularly popular.

If your life, like my life, seems to be a bundle of knots lately, perhaps it is time to ask the Mother of Jesus to untie them for us through her powerful intercession. Mary, untie them, please!
