CLERGY REFLECTION

On July 11, 1833, a young priest named Dom Prosper Gueranger celebrated Mass for the feast of St. Benedict at his Benedictine Monastery in Solesmes, France. That may seem normal—we're used to celebrating the saints and celebrating their Masses on their feast days. In 1833, however, this was a novelty of sorts. After the French Revolution, religious life was abolished in France, where Catholicism had once laid the foundation for their culture. The thought was, "If you're not contributing to the nation, you're against us." Fear gripped those in power. The fear was that there were people willing to give allegiance to something, or rather Someone, other than themselves. The solution was to dissolve them, or to send them away, or in some instances, to add them to the martyrology.

Dom Gueranger, a young diocesan priest, saw the direction of the culture desired to preserve what had been passed down for almost two millennia. Growing up under the shadows of the 1,000 year old monastery in Solesmes, he desired to restore religious life within those stone walls.

Some people thought he was crazy, overly zealous, and unreasonable to restore an old order where the life predominantly consisted in an enclosed life of chanting the psalms and the Mass. He was determined, however, if it was the will of God. When asked why he thought this would work, he said, "The need of the Church seemed to me so urgent, the ideas about true Christianity so falsified and so compromised in the lay and ecclesiastical world, that I felt nothing but an urgency to found some kind of center wherein to recollect and revive pure traditions."

Dom Gueranger, along with St. Benedict, whose feast is this Tuesday, knew that "culture" depended on "cult". What or whom we worship determines what culture values. While we can fall into the same mindset of Gueranger's contemporaries—ideals of worldly efficiencies or earthly prosperity—we must be reminded by these two remarkable men: Nothing is more important in this life than to know, love, and serve the Lord. As things continue to rapidly change in our world, may we remain rooted in the One who remains the same. May our worship be sincere and our work be pure.
