

Please, <u>do not</u> take pictures during the Mass celebration. You are welcome to take pictures <u>after</u> Mass.



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Isaiah 55:10-11

Thus says the LORD:

Just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Psalm 65:10, 11, 12-13, 14 (*Refrain sung first by cantor, then congregation repeat*)



You visit the earth, give it water; you fill it with riches. God's ever-flowing river brims over to prepare the grain. R

You crown the year with your bounty. Abundance flows in your pathways; in pastures of the desert it flows. The hills are girded with joy. **R**

SECOND READING

Romans 8:18-23

Brothers and sisters:

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us. For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of God.

We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. (Sung first by cantor, then congregation repeat)



The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower. All who come to him will have life forever. R

GOSPEL

Matthew 13:1-23

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore.

And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?"

He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says:

You shall indeed hear but not understand, you shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them.

"But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

"Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

(bow here) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.

He ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.







ECCE AGNUS DEI


Celebrant: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.



CLERGY REFLECTION

Offering, sharing and participating in Cathedral Inspires Campaign is sowing seeds in a spiritual farm field. Fifteenth Sunday in ordinary time calls us to reflect on sown seeds. God never forgets a seed sown in faith. Every farmer believes and hopes that he is going to get his fruit. Every prayer, every confession, every sacrifice, every seed sown, every time you forgave, every time you loved when it was hard. God remembers it all. He counts it as seed for you and He is sending a harvest. God has said and confirmed, "I never forget a seed." Let those words encourage you today. The seed is the embryonic stage of the plant life cycle. Seeds are tiny things with a big job: producing beautiful, delicious, sustainable and diverse food. But how do you know a seed is a good one? A good seed grows into something you want to eat. Different foods and flavors can be unique to regions, cultures, and countries. But the industrialized agriculture of the past century has pushed for crop uniformity at the expense of local tradition and innovation. Seed savers select seeds from best tasting crops, keeping unique, traditional flavors alive amid waves of homogenous industrial crops. Saving time-tested seeds means we can continue enjoying the flavors we love, year after year. A good seed not only produces good food, but also more good seeds that growers can save, share and replant. A good seed makes the most of the soil, water and light that are available in its environment, while resisting local pests and diseases. Saving seed from the year's best crops to plant the following year makes for better seeds over time. The conditions each farmer works with vary by location-even from farm to farm. Where one farm might have steady spring rain, a late frost and clay-laden soil, another farm might have scorching summer sun, sandy soil and no frost to speak of. A one-seed-fits-all approach doesn't work. A diversity of climates, soils and stresses calls for a diversity of seeds so farmers can conserve choice, beauty, flavor and abundance. As today's Gospel reflects (Matthew 13:1-12), the parable of the sower is related with our Cathedral Inspires Campaign. So let us sow our seed both in faith and deed; we are invited to reflect on our spiritual seeds.
