

GOSPEL

Matthew 13:24-43

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn."""

He proposed another parable to them.

"The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches.""

He spoke to them another parable.

"The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened."

All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables.

He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet:

I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world.

Then, dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field."

He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (bow here) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



CLERGY REFLECTION

I'm not sure that I can ever remember "air quality warnings" for South Dakota. Of course, I'm not sure that I can ever remember a summer where the smell of smoke in the air was so ubiquitously prominent, or a summer where most days the sky has been darkened by such a thick, fog-like haze that the sun becomes invisible, and the blue sky completely vanishes. It's all attributed to wildfires burning out of control in Canada, we are told. It's eerie if you ask me. Abigail noted that their garden tomatoes are not growing according to plan, they are still green and small. Is this due to the air quality? Even if not, there is no doubt it has affected the health of humans. Someone told me they went out for a walk in this haze and came back coughing like a banshee. Or take for instance the images of New York and Chicago covered in a murky mist so thick that the few buildings that can be seen look ominous and foreboding. Almost reminds a person of a catastrophe of apocalyptic proportions. Is this a harbinger of things to come? Is this what it will be like at the end of the world? Not to be morbid or fear mongering, it does enter my mind when I see the strange sunrises and sunsets covered over by clouds of smoke.

Our minds and hearts can be clouded over at times too, a smoky haze can obstruct the light of Gospel truth which sidetracks us from living in the fullness of God's freedom. That is why we want to be counted among the righteous by keeping our eyes fixed on the glimmer of light that pierces through at moments when we need the rays of God's mercy and direction the most. In pondering this, I think of Jesus' description of the end times in today's Gospel. The "weeds" of unbelievers and deceivers will be tossed into a "fiery furnace." Think of the smoke and haze that will descend upon the world when that day comes upon us. If it's anything like we are experiencing now, we can be thankful that God has let us in on the secret. We have time to prepare. Jesus is adamant that we MUST be prepared for the end of the age when all this will happen. To be counted among the righteous, our faith must grow upward and outward toward heavenly realities. It must grow naturally like the wheat, the mustard seed and the leavened bread described in Jesus' parables for this Sunday. Forget about the "smoky haze" of discouragement within our lives. It all disappears when we live for God and not for ourselves or for the world. Whoever has ears ought to hear. Fr. James Morgan
