



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

CLERGY REFLECTION

Several times in the Gospels Jesus talks about his message being divisive, especially in a family. No doubt he experienced that in his own day and it is as true as ever today. The proclamation of the kingdom of heaven causes divisiveness because everyone does not receive the message the same way. To be clear, Jesus holds the family sacred and he desires all of us to spend eternity with him in heaven. But let's face it, not everyone shares that same desire. And since we all have a free will, we get to choose what we believe and how we live.

This is a painful reality for true followers of Jesus because we desire not only to spend eternity with Jesus in heaven, we also desire those we love to be there with us. But many are not willing to believe in Jesus and are unwilling to live as he taught us to live. Family members will often drift apart from a common faith Tradition and it often results in arguments and conflict.

We are called to live out our faith and to lead others to Christ. by the way we live. When others reject our beliefs and choose a different path, it hurts. Especially when those people are the ones we love most. How should we react to this rejection? We should remain faithful to our God in all things. We should not compromise our beliefs in order to keep peace in the family and we should not be hesitant to live out our faith in the presence of the unbelievers we love. When others reject God and all that Jesus taught, we experience some of the same pain and suffering Jesus experienced on his way to the cross. For many of us that is the cross Jesus asks us to pick up and carry as we follow him. And there are a couple other things we are called to do as we are carrying that cross. We are called to never stop loving the unbelievers in our life and to continue to pray for all those who are presently rejecting God just as Jesus did when he was hanging on the cross.

It can be so frustrating when we are unable to change the self-destructive choices made by those we love. But we must also remember that we are not God. We are His followers, and we follow Him because we know He is the way, and the truth and the life and that anything is possible for God. Have a blessed week!
