

Please, <u>do not</u> take pictures during the Mass celebration. You are welcome to take pictures <u>after</u> Mass.



CLERGY REFLECTION

Much is being written about the movie "Oppenheimer." I have not seen the movie but those who have seen it say it is a serious movie that challenges you to think. Peggy Noonan, of the *Wall Street Journal*, even wrote an op-ed on the film, extolling its brilliance while expressing her disappointment that the movie did not go far enough depicting the inner struggles of the man who invented "the bomb." As Noonan states: *He (Oppenheimer) would split the atom, create the bomb, bring the peace. But the bomb was—is—a moral horror. So to be great, to achieve his destiny, he had to do something terrible. He did. That was his tragedy...A lifetime wandering around quoting, "I am become death, the destroyer of worlds."*

Some history is in order: J. Robert Oppenheimer was a theoretical physicist who led the government sponsored program (the Manhattan Project) tasked with designing the first nuclear weapon. America was in the thick of World War II then, and our leaders were intent on developing a weapon that would end the war quickly, especially the war in the Pacific where the death toll of soldiers and civilians was becoming astronomical. After developing and testing the bomb, it was dropped on the large city of Hiroshima, Japan on Aug. 6, 1945. As Noonan states, quoting from a magazine article of the day: There was no sound of planes. The morning was still; the place was cool and pleasant. Then a tremendous flash of light cut across the sky... It seemed a sheet of sun. There was no roar; almost no one in Hiroshima recalls hearing any noise of the bomb. But they heard it 20 miles away. Clouds of dust turned the morning into twilight. The devastation was incalculable. The city was completely leveled. Somewhere between 90,000 to 140,000 thousand people died in the explosion. Countless others would die later from radiation poisoning. The increase of cancer and birth defects grew exponentially in the years following. Given the gravity of the times, it probably didn't dawn on government officials that the day they chose to drop the Atom Bomb was also the Feast of the Transfiguration. The irony is not lost on us. These two opposite events can help us put the reality of God's glory and human sinfulness into perspective: First, is the brilliant light radiating from Jesus as He is "transfigured" on the mountaintop, and the cloud from which is heard the words of the Father: This is my beloved Son; listen to Him. Juxtapose this scene with the dropping of the atomic bomb: A blinding flash of light, a dense, dark, demonic, mushroom cloud, and the greatest devastation humankind has ever seen. The Lord Jesus "transfigures;" fallen humanity "disfigures." Christ is the radiant light of life; human fallibility is the radiant light of death. God has created us in His image and likeness, and when we act as His beloved maximizing that image and likeness...we "transfigure" instead of "disfigure." The Father reveals to us our true selves in the likeness of His Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ.
