

Please, <u>do not</u> take pictures during the Mass celebration. You are welcome to take pictures <u>after</u> Mass.



GOSPEL

Matthew 14:22-33

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds.

After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone.

Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it.

During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified.

"It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear.

At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."

He said, "Come."

Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!"

Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down.

Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God."




CLERGY REFLECTION

The first time I heard properly the word of God a reading from the (1st book of Kings 19:9-13) was in my home village. I and my best friend Joseph Lorenzo were grade three students. In this reading Prophet Elijah was told to go out to wait for God. The story was so scary and a man who was reading it was also reading in such scary way. When he said; "A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the Lord but the Lord was not in the wind" we both started shivering in behalf of Prophet Elijah as if it was happening at the moment and we can't wait to hear what was going to happen.

In Matthew's Gospel reading it tells that, Jesus during the fourth watch of the night, he went toward his apostles, walking on the sea. It is really impossible for someone to walk on the sea but if we open our eyes of the faith we can still see that living in this world is like we are walking in an ocean of sin. We could say that the Church being and surviving in this generation is a great miracle.

The greatest miracles in the Bible prove the greatness and power of God. God who performs miracles; He displays His power among the peoples. See (Psalm 77:12-14). A miracle is an unusual manifestation of God's power in which He intervenes in human affairs. Miracles display God's power, inspire wonder, and act as signs that prove who God is or substantiate His message to the world. *A miracle is a supernatural event that reveals or confirms a specific divine message.*

In the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord in my homily I shared about revelation of God through miraculous way and I told this; There was a man I met in a shopping mall and he asked me if I am a Catholic priest and I said yes I am. He goes and said well my question for you is that many protestant pastors and prophets work hard to perform miracle but you Catholics don't, what is the reason? And I told him that we do perform miracles every single day during consecration we change bread and wine to the body and blood of Christ. Every single day we have real Jesus on the altar and all the members of our church when they receive Holy Communion, they touch the real Jesus. There is nothing greater than this miracle. I don't know about others, maybe they don't have real Jesus at hand that is why they wanted to bring down Jesus by force using unknown language. We should know receiving Holy Communion is a great Fr. Pasquale Armando Francesco miracle.
