ECCE AGNUS DEI


Celebrant: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

CLERGY REFLECTION

Last week we celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption when Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven. One week later we celebrate the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I think at times we can overlook the significance of these words. Mary as queen is not merely a nice title—it is a glimpse into her role in our lives as disciples of her son.

Although we do not live in a monarchy, most people know that a king and queen are husband and wife. In Ancient Israel, however, that is not the case. In the first two chapters of 1 Kings there are two interesting exchanges with the King. In the first chapter David is king, and his wife is Bathsheba. She goes into the presence of the king (David, her husband) and bows to him. In the next chapter, after the death of David, his son Solomon is king. When Bathsheba, now the king's mother, enters, King Solomon rises from his throne, bows to her, is seated on his throne, and has a seat for her at his right. The queen is not the wife of the king but the mother of the king. The reason Bathsheba is coming to Solomon is because there was a man named Adonijah who was making a request to Solomon but knew the authority of a mother. He knew that even the king would not deny a worthy request made by his mother.

Mary is not merely an example for us. She is not just sitting off to the side to encourage us. She continues to have a role in interceding for us. May we enthrone Jesus as the King of our lives, and entrust our prayers to His Mother, the Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia; For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia.

Has risen, as he said, alleluia; Pray for us to God, alleluia. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.
