





#### GOSPEL

#### Matthew 16:13-20

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. 

### CLERGY REFLECTION

#### Who do you say that I am?

Who am I? In general terms, think of the many different ways we could answer this question. Our answer would likely include our name, family, address, place of birth, where we work and maybe even our hobbies, all of which would give a basic understanding of who we are. But what if we asked a friend or a close acquaintance to share who they think we are? In describing us, would our Christian faith be a significant part of their description of us or would it even be mentioned?

Peter, in this weekend's gospel from Matthew, receives from Jesus a clear understanding of who he is. "You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church." Peter's new identity originates directly from his relationship with Jesus. Apart from Jesus he is still Simon the fisherman. When he is clear on who Jesus is, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God", Peter then has clarity on who he is through God's eyes.

I find this same scenario to be true in my own life. Prior to having a personal relationship with Jesus, I would describe who I was by using the general terms that I mentioned abovefocusing primarily on my family, work and personal interests. But after opening my heart to a relationship with Jesus, the answer to the question "who am I" changed dramatically. I became Catholic. Even though I was baptized Catholic as an infant and raised by devote Catholic parents, my faith did not play a significant role in my life. Rather it was something I did out of obedience to my parents and God rather than being in relationship with him. So when I say that I became Catholic, I mean that I embraced in my heart the Church, the Body of Christ, founded upon Peter and the Apostles, the first Pope and bishops of the Church. It meant living out my faith in full communion with all that Jesus established through the Magisterium of the Church.

As our Christian culture and moral beliefs come under constant attack from all sides, it might be a good time to clarify who we are and how we live our lives. In other words, if we profess to be Catholic, do our actions reflect what we believe or are we Catholic in name only? As things become more divisive in our society, being lukewarm in our faith will make it difficult to choose between good or evil. The one way we can know for certain of who we truly are is by remaining steadfast in our relationship with Jesus and anchored in his one holy, catholic and apostolic Church, because it is promised "the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it."
