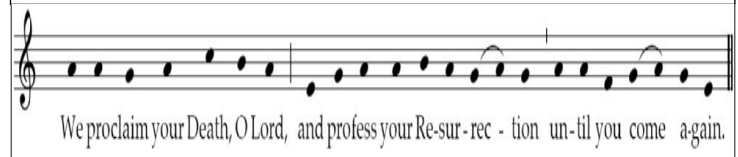

CLERGY REFLECTION

This past week I took our office staff on retreat to Broomtree. We arrived Wednesday afternoon for some down time, then we prayed together in the evening – Evening Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours and adoration/benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Then, before bedtime, we had a discussion on the topic of saints, specifically on this point: “What saint would you like to meet one day and what question would you like to ask them?” This made for lively conversation, as you might imagine. This might make for lively conversation for you and your guests the next time you host a dinner party. On Thursday morning, we began the day with Morning Prayer from the LOH, followed by a talk from Emily Leedom of the Lourdes Center on “what defines us as a parish and a parish staff.” Following the talk, we prayed the rosary and celebrated Mass together. After lunch, Emily gave a second talk on adapting to change and accompanying our parishioners on the spiritual/pastoral journey. Given the new *Set Ablaze* pastoral planning implementation underway in our diocese, this subject was certainly apropos.

I began to do retreats with office staff when I was a Pastor at Holy Spirit. It was obvious to me that a parish staff, with as much work as they do indirectly in the area of pastoral ministry, needs to be spiritually fortified for the good work that they do to keep parish operations operable. And not to mention, the interaction daily with people from all walks-of-life. That in itself demands spiritual fortification. Taking a day to pray for self-reflection and receive personal enrichment, makes for a more unified, cohesive staff, and gives them a sense of a higher purpose working for the church. Our parish staff members at the Cathedral may have job titles, but each and every one of them wear many different hats. They are dedicated to the care of the Cathedral, and they go above and beyond the call of duty, daily. Unlike a regular 8 to 5 job, they spend many additional hours in the office, or even working from home, to ensure that programs/operations run smoothly, and that we are good stewards with what has been given to us. Of course, that responsibility and dedication to the Cathedral includes our custodians as well. Please, the next time you stop in the office, thank them for their dedication and commitment.

A retreat, or any kind of respite from our busy schedules, can put us in touch with God, refocus the lens of our spiritual life, and reorder our priorities. St. Paul puts it quite succinctly. To quote our second reading, for YOUR self-reflection, meditate on this: *I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.*
