





#### CLERGY REFLECTION

Since the beginning of the war in Ethiopia, Eritrean refugees in Tigray region have been exposed to danger. Neither the Ethiopian government nor the UNHCR have been able to guarantee their safety. In early 2021, Eritrean troops destroyed two refugee camps for Eritreans in Tigray, dispersing and forcibly returning approximately 20,000 refugees.

Eritrean refugees had fled a country with one of the worst human rights records in the world, and are now being targeted, killed, and otherwise abused in Ethiopia. Ethiopian refugee camps are no longer safe for Eritrean refugees.

In 2022 Alem Wach refugee camp in Dabat, North Gondar, Amhara region, Ethiopia, becomes a hive of activity as women, men, and children hurrying to get off several buses before milling around the few trucks offloading their personal belongings. After settling in this camp peacefully the war broke out in all directions and they are surrounded by war. Eritrean refugees living in Ethiopia continue to face hunger and attacks as fighting in the country's northern areas continues.

This war affected the Amhara region and hunger is all over the region. For about four months the refugees have survived without food. The worst thing is people from the region are stealing and looting from refugee camps every single day and if they don't give what they have they are killed mercilessly in their tents. Fellow Eritreans have tried to do Samaritan work and it is still not easy for them to feed this entire people.

Now we are looking for a way to fundraise and help them to get food for the refugees in Dabat Camp. We would appreciate if there any ideas to get fundraising ways.
