

GOSPEL

Matthew 18:21-35

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?"

Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventyseven times.

That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants.

When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt.

At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.'

Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan.

When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.'

But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt.

Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair.

His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?'

Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt.

So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."



R. May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.





CLERGY REFLECTION

"How good and how pleasant it is, when brothers live in unity."

Spending time in people's homes, spending time with kids at school, being a brother myself, and having lived in seminary for 8 years, I know that it is not an easy thing to always live in unity under the same roof. Yet, this psalm rings true—how truly good and pleasant it is when there is a shared life that fosters unity.

One of Bishop DeGrood's desires for **Set Ablaze** is that priests have the opportunity to collaborate more together, and in some cases, where possible, to live together. My assignment is a bit unique, and I am living with Fr. Michael Kapperman, our vocation director, along with 4 of our seminarians. The Church has been asking for a period of time (often times 1 year) at the beginning of seminary formation to do what is called the propaedeutic stage. The seminary is a place to help a man hear God's voice, form the man to be able to respond to His call, and if continuing on towards priesthood, to form him to be a faithful priest for the Church. Yet the Church has recognized that in our present age, many people, especially young people, are plagued by the noise and confusion of society, often times at no fault of their own. The propaedeutic stage is meant to be a year stepping away from the world and focusing on human and spiritual formation. They have some academic work, but very limited in comparison to the normal load to come in seminary. They have some exposure to ministry at parishes and schools, to expose them to some aspects of priestly life. Yet their biggest obligation is to focus on their own human and spiritual growth. They all have a fast from technology throughout the year, have a daily holy hour and Mass together, spiritual reading, cooking for the house, and many other things that will help them to grow as a man and as a son of God.

It has been a gift to be living with them and with Fr. Kapperman. As a priest, I have found great friendship with brother priests, and I am glad to be able to witness that to these seminarians. You may see them at the 4:00pm Mass on Saturday afternoons serving for the Bishop. Please pray for them, that they may have a fruitful year, and that we may experience the true goodness of brothers living in unity. God bless you, Fr. Tony Klein
