



Jesus told his disciples this parable:

After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard.

Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off.

And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise.

Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?'

They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.'

He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.'

When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.'

When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage.

And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.'

He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go.

What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?'

Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."





CLERGY REFLECTION

Years ago I was nearing the end of a very busy day which included driving many miles between meetings in two different states. It was about 9:00 at night and I was still driving toward my destination for the night. I was on a two lane road, in a rural area of Minnesota, and it was dark. I had been driving for quite some time and had sort of slipped into semi-consciousness as can happen in such circumstances. All of a sudden the car phone rang, shaking me out of my stupor. I answered the phone and the first words I heard on the other end were "Where are you?" I looked around me as I continued down the road and answered honestly; "I don't know" I said.

In pondering what to write about this week, this episode came back to me, seemingly out of nowhere.

Although I have been asked this question on more than one occasion, in various circumstances, the question has been echoing around in my head and my heart today. How many times have I found myself virtually sleep-walking through parts of my day functioning pretty much on automatic? I'm afraid it has been more times than I can count. Perhaps you have had similar experiences in your life.

This is the very question God asked Adam and Eve in Genesis 3:9 when he was walking through the garden looking for them after they had eaten the forbidden fruit. "Where are you?" He asked. Of course Adam and Eve were hiding from God because they knew they had disobeyed Him and violated His trust. But the thing is, they couldn't hide from God and neither can we. We can choose to ignore Him and take Him for granted. We can even try to blame Him for our misfortunes or accuse Him of not listening to us and answering our prayers. At times like that we may even shout out to Him in our frustration; "Where are you, God?" Many of us have had moments like this but, when we ask God that question, be prepared for His answer because it will always be the same. "I am right here, walking at your side." He might even have a question for you that resembles the very question he asked our first parents in the garden. "Where are you, my child?"

As we go through our day, let us try to stay in the moment so we may be aware of God's presence in our day, and look to Him always to guide us on the right path as we journey through this life.
