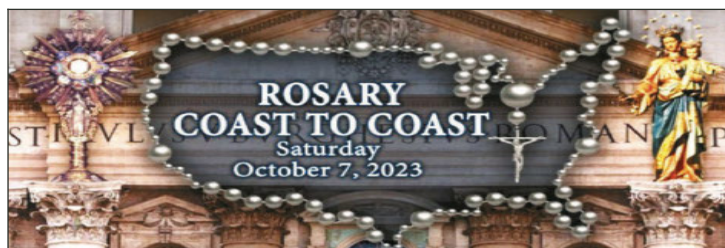

CLERGY REFLECTION

In a spirit of humility, and with a grateful heart reaching to heaven, I'm happy to announce that we have completed our *InSpires Capital Campaign* for a new organ, the restoration of the historical rectory and endowments for their benefit! We have pledges from over 400 people – parishioners, friends of the Cathedral, and visitors alike – totaling \$10 million that will fund the campaign over the next five years! I'm so grateful to the parishioners and friends of the Cathedral who listened to our case and supported us early on in the "silent" portion of the campaign. I'm certainly grateful to the parishioners and friends of the Cathedral who finished the "Cathedral" portion of the campaign by pledging the final \$1 million to finish our fundraising efforts. Thank you!

I'm so proud of our people and parish! You have defied the odds, and your support and prayers made this happen in the end. I'm so thankful to the Catholic faithful in Sioux Falls and around the Diocese who have such a love for the Cathedral and what she represents, so much so, that their generosity would make this needed endeavor a reality. We are all part of the "Cathedral family." People from far and wide have made this happen...and there still may be some who desire to be a part of it, but are not sure what to pledge or give. Perhaps you are still praying about it. You can still give to the rectory or the organ project, or to the endowments. Given the nature of construction projects and contingencies associated with them, the need will always be there, so please don't hesitate to participate, even if have met a "goal" in pledges. It's the Cathedral. There will always be another phase, another project, constant maintenance.

We all know the folktale *"The Little Engine That Could."* It's a story about optimism in the face of huge challenges. In the tale, a long train must be pulled over a high mountain after its locomotive breaks down. It's a daunting task. The request is sent to a small engine, who agrees to try. Despite the steep climb and heavy load, the engine slowly succeeds in pulling the train over the mountain while repeating the motto: "I-think-I-can, I-think-I-can," overcoming a seemingly impossible challenge. Through the ordeal, the little engine acquires pride, character, identity, a new-found confidence, and above all, a grateful heart. Since 2016 – when the first discussion of restoring the rectory surfaced, and when we learned that the organ had to be replaced, and subsequently pursuing countless meetings, pouring over details, studies, inspections, assessments, inquiries, etc., and in the midst of it all confronting a pandemic – our mantra was always "we-think-we-can." We could never have achieved what we have achieved without the people of good faith and God's intervention. Through it all, prayer to the Miraculous Infant Jesus of Prague, was our constant reminder of what God can do with the help of human initiative. We did it! Thank you! Let's celebrate!
