





FIRST READING

Isaiah 5:1-7

Let me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard.

My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside; he spaded it, cleared it of stones, and planted the choicest vines; within it he built a watchtower, and hewed out a wine press. Then he looked for the crop of grapes, but what it yielded was wild grapes.

Now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard: What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done? Why, when I looked for the crop of grapes, did it bring forth wild grapes?

Now, I will let you know what I mean to do with my vineyard: take away its hedge, give it to grazing, break through its wall, let it be trampled! Yes, I will make it a ruin: it shall not be pruned or hoed, but overgrown with thorns and briers; I will command the clouds not to send rain upon it.

The vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, and the people of Judah are his cherished plant; he looked for judgment, but see, bloodshed! for justice, but hark, the outcry!

Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you.

GOSPEL

Matthew 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey.

When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him.

What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?"

They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times."

Jesus said to them,

"Did you never read in the Scriptures: The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes?

Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."







CLERGY REFLECTION

On 10th February 1993 St. John Paul II, Pope, (Feast day October 22) in his pastoral visitation to Sudan, when Sudan was not yet divided, he said; "My visit to the Sudan is a source of great satisfaction to me in the fulfilment of my religious and pastoral ministry as the Bishop of Rome, the head of the Catholic Church. I am happy to have been able to come to



Khartoum, even if it was not possible to consider a more extended visit to other parts of the country, in order to offer the message of reconciliation and hope which is at the heart of Catholicism and which I bring to all the Sudanese people, irrespective of differences of religion or ethnic origin. I have looked forward especially to the opportunity to give encouragement to the citizens of this country who are sons and daughters of the Church, and whose deeply-felt aspiration is to cooperate harmoniously and effectively with their fellow-citizens in building a better society for all Sudanese."




This month is also a month when Muslim believers respect and celebrate a Roman Catholic saint. St. Daniel Comboni is well known in both North and South Sudan and celebrated on October 10th. He was a great missionary in Sudan who brought Christianity to Sudan. Have you ever heard of Daniel Comboni, an Italian priest? He used to dress like a Muslim Shush

merchant to buy slaves and then he would set them free. This

makes him honored by Muslims.

Recently the beautiful city of North Sudan, Khartoum, was on fire. Seeing Khartoum's Greater Nile Petroleum Oil Company Tower in flames is truly painful. The Architect mourned as iconic Sudan skyscraper was engulfed in flames: 'such senseless destruction'.



Remembering that we have Sudanese in our parish we pray through the intercession of both St. Daniel Comboni and St. John Paul II, Pope, that God may watch over these countries to stop the conflict in both North and South Sudan.
