

Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come.

A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."'

Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them.

The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city.

Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment.

The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence.

Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.'

Many are invited, but few are chosen."





CLERGY REFLECTION

"The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church." So said Tertullian, an early Christian theologian and apologist, who saw much blood shed in defense of Christ. Being a Christian in the 2nd Century was not easy - it was a very demanding decision. Depending on where you lived, it could have been a death sentence.

This week we celebrate 3+ martyrs - some old and some new. Tuesday is the memorial of St. Ignatius of Antioch, an early Church Patriarch (bishop) and martyr. As he was led to his martyrdom in Rome, he had his sight set on one thing alone - communion with Jesus Christ: "Let fire and the cross, let the companies of wild beasts, let breaking of bones and tearing of limbs... come upon me; be it so, only may I win Jesus Christ."

Wednesday is the feast of St. Luke, one of the four evangelists, who is also believed to be a martyr in the 1st century. Don't be fooled, however, that martyrdom is fossilized in the first 3 centuries of the Church.

Thursday is the memorial of Saints John de Brébuf, Isaac Jogues and their companions, sometimes referred to as the North American Martyrs, who were martyred in the 17th century. In an effort to bring the saving truth of the Gospel to Canada/Northern North America, they endured torture to the point of death. St. John de Brébuf was so zealous for the Gospel and so united to Christ, that even in the midst of torture he did not cease to love and care for these people. He continued to proclaim the truth of the Gospel to the annoyance of his captors, causing them to cut off his tongue to prevent him to speak.

A common theme throughout all of these martyrdoms (and most martyrdoms) is that those who are killing them think they are getting rid of Christianity. "If we can get rid of those who preach about Jesus and the Church, we can get rid of Jesus and the Church." Yet the blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church. In times and places of persecution, the faith is often strengthened through their witness to Christ.

We know there are still martyrs today throughout the world. May we pray for those who risk their lives daily to witness to Christ, and may we pray for the courage to be firm in the faith, despite the persecutions we may endure.

All you holy martyrs, *pray for us!*
