# CLERGY REFLECTION

As I talk with family, friends and others I meet day-to-day, the topic of local, national and world events seems to be on everyone's mind. There are varied levels of worry or concern over the events making the news headlines. I have witnessed how too much news and social media can have an adverse effect on one's life by causing excess worry, anxiety, and confusion. It can be difficult to maintain a healthy balance of staying abreast of current events so that one can be informed on how to intercede in prayer verses letting it begin to consume their lives. We must prayerfully discern the information we listen to in order to help us understand the truth and make informed decisions.

Sadly, I have family members who are feeding off a steady diet of conspiracy theories and modern day prophets that have led them away from the truth and practice of their Catholic faith. Satan's best tool is to bombard us with fear, worry and anxiety to get us to take our eyes off of Jesus and fix our gaze on the chaos and so-called impending doom surrounding us.

Psalm 18, the Responsorial Psalm for this weekend, is a great psalm to pray when we are feeling overwhelmed by the events happening around us and especially when we are experiencing trials and tribulations in our personal lives. I quote from Psalm 18, "My God, my rock of refuge, my shield, the horn of my salvation, my stronghold! Praised be the Lord, I exclaim, and I am safe from my enemies." These verses contain all that we need to remain steadfast in our hope as Christians. Our hope is in a God that will never abandon or forsake us and will supply all our needs. All he asks of us is to trust him with our entire lives so that he can be our refuge, our shield and our salvation.

Given what is taking place in our world and in our Church today, keeping our eyes focused on Jesus is the only sure way that we will have peace in our spirit. But we are called to do more than to cling to our own inner peace. We are called to give witness to the source of our peace. As the world around us increases in conflict, the need and desire for peace will also grow. As Christians, we understand that peace is more than the lack of conflict; peace is the person of Jesus, a peace much of the world does not know. So if the current events are causing you to feel less peace, I would invite you to spend less time listening to the world and instead spend more time listening to Jesus.
