CLERGY REFLECTION

What is life after death?

Do you know that it is very easy for an African to believe in life after death? Most of African Traditional Religions have the concept of life after death and also there are some rituals done several times in a year at their cemeteries or the tombs of their family members. Some of them offer real food and drinks to satisfy all the departed souls until the souls join their ancestors and rest in peace.

Ancient Egyptian kings desiccated their bodies for use in the afterlife and built pyramids - 'resurrection machines' (Mummification) – that would ensure the pharaoh had eternal life by transfiguring him into a star, living on in the night sky forever. Pharaohs were buried with their earthly things and also their servants were buried with the king. Sometimes they buried them alive thinking they were going to continue living the same life, simply changing to the next place, like moving to a new city and a new house.

Our Church teaches that immediately after death our soul separates from our earthly body, and we stand before God for judgement. We then enter heaven, purgatory or hell.

Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longing, the state of supreme, definitive happiness. Those who are free from all sin enter heaven immediately. Purgatory is a place of purification for those who die in a state of grace and friendship with God, but who are not yet fully purified. Those in purgatory are assured a place in heaven after their purification. We pray for those in purgatory, that they may soon be with God in heaven. I would like you to get a book called 'An Unpublished **Manuscript On Purgatory'** by Sisters M.de L.C. to know more about purgatory. Hell is for those who have willingly chosen to reject God and his love. If we persist in a state of serious sin, we damn ourselves to hell. At the end of time, our Lord will come again to judge the living and the dead. All souls will be rejoined with their bodies, and those in purgatory will be joined to the blessed in heaven. The Last Judgement will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
