



But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money.


"After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them.





CLERGY REFLECTION

This Thursday we celebrate Thanksgiving, a national holiday that innately acknowledges that what we have has been received. In a society that focuses on "What can I achieve?" it is a sobering reminder that we ought to first recognize "What have I received?" A basic principle in philosophy is that nothing comes from nothing. Acknowledging that, we then see how everything that we have has a source from which it comes.

Abraham Lincoln, in his 1863 statement on this national holiday, reminded the young nation of the many gifts that had been given in the past year. He then acknowledged that, "To these bounties, *which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come*, other blessings have been added."

Rome is wasted on the Romans, and unfortunately the gifts of God are sometimes wasted on those who are surrounded by them. It is so easy to overlook what we have because we're frequently reminded of what we don't have. Taking the time to acknowledge what we're grateful for is good—but we cannot forget to acknowledge that those things come from someone. We are indeed thankful for things, but we must also be thankful to someone. In this case, of course, we can always trace back gifts to God, from whom all blessings flow.

In addition to Thanksgiving, Thursday is the feast of Blessed Miguel Pro, one of my favorite saints. He was a Jesuit priest who was martyred in the Mexican persecution in the 20th Century. Despite the persecution, he was faithful to his priestly promises, to his ministry, and did it all with a sense of joy and humor. Being close to our own time and nation, he is a great model for us of how to endure suffering and persecution, seeing in them an opportunity for a closer union with Jesus Christ.

May you have a blessed Thanksgiving! God bless you! Fr. Klein
