





Brothers and sisters:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him.

And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left.

Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.'

Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?'

And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels.

For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?'

He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

PROFESSION OF FAITH Please Stand I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (bow here) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

CLERGY REFLECTION

In the past couple years I have become much more aware of the distractions in my life and how I deal with them (or not). I am pretty sure we all have times when we are distracted because of all the things screaming for our attention. Our job, our family, preparing for retirement, planning a vacation, completing our school assignments, our hobbies, etc. There are many factors involved in determining how we spend our time. Most of the time those decisions are heavily influenced by what is most important to us at any given moment. Where does our relationship with God fit in to our daily routine? There are many times each day when we may be called to prayer but find the time short-circuited by distractions. I became acutely aware of the magnitude of distractions in my prayer life a couple years ago when I realized how often I was checking my phone in the middle of Morning or Evening Prayer. Did I have any messages? What was the next thing on my schedule? I had to ask myself why I kept my phone right at my fingertips when I was trying to pray. This practice was only encouraging me to give in to even minor distractions in the middle of what should have been the most sacred part of my day with the most important person in my life (Jesus Christ).

One day an image came to me in prayer of my future encounter with Jesus at the time of my particular judgement at the hour of my death. My soul approaches Jesus seated on his throne at the gates of heaven. There is a long line but suddenly it is my turn. As I approach Jesus a phone rings and Jesus says to me "hold on a minute, Bill. I have to get this call." Every time that image comes to me I have to chuckle because I know Jesus would not do that. So why would I do it to him? This has helped me cut down tremendously on how much I allow myself to be distracted during prayer time. Next week we begin the Season of Advent. Without question it is the time of year filled with the most distractions of any time of the year. Don't allow the distractions of the secular Christmas Season to rob you of the sacredness of the Advent Season and the approaching birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. There is No One and No Thing more important.
