

Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, with the mountains quaking before you, while you wrought awesome deeds we could not hope for, such as they had not heard of from of old.


No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you doing such deeds for those who wait for him.







CLERGY REFLECTION

Each August I take the parish staff to Broom Tree for a one -day "staff retreat." For my homily on All Saints Day, I described one of the exercises we did during the retreat. Each member of the staff was to pick a saint that they would like to meet if that saint were alive today. But there was more to it: When you met your saint, what question would you like to ask them? I deviated a bit from the exercise because it reminded me of a similar exercise I did as part of a 30-day Ignatian retreat on the 10th anniversary of my priesthood. On that retreat, I had to pray five hours a day, mostly meditating upon the Gospel stories of Jesus. The idea was to insert myself into the picture, put myself into the stories themselves, so I could viscerally experience what was taking place. The practice is called "Lectio Divina" in our Catholic faith. One of the most vivid meditations I had was walking with Joseph and Mary to Bethlehem. It was a part of a meditation on Christ's birth. Here I was, seeing myself as the camel driver, or the servant, which ever, helping them along the journey. I pictured myself in the evening setting up my own camp some distance away from them. I could see myself sitting by a fire, looking over at Joseph and Mary and wondering what they were talking about, knowing all along, that something miraculous would happen once we arrived in Bethlehem. Both Joseph and Mary became very personal to me in this prayer encounter. Now, back to the retreat: What would I ask Joseph if I had a chance to meet him? Exactly. What were you and Mary talking about on the journey to Bethlehem? As we enter the season of Advent, traveling with Joseph and Mary to Bethlehem should be at the heart of our Advent experience, otherwise, we miss out on the surprise of Christmas. Advent is about anticipation and preparation. And it is a season that is separate from Christmas. This year, each of the office staff, including the priests and deacons, received a book of Advent reflections that employs vivid meditation as a way to connect to the Infancy narratives. It's titled, "Rejoice! An Advent Pilgrimage Into The Heart of Scripture," from Ascension Press. The author is Fr. Mark Toups, who I know personally from my seminary days in Rome. Perusing it, I find it is essentially Lectio Divina. Each reflection inserts you into the story. For example, the reflections have you speaking to the different Advent characters. Whether we use a meditation guide or not, Lectio Divina is the perfect spiritual practice for Advent. As we enter the Advent season, be sure to make it a journey. Concentrate on walking with Joseph and Mary. Meditate...and put yourself within the story, not outside of it.
