### FIRST READING

But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a mighty roar and the elements will be dissolved by fire, and the earth and everything done on it will be found out.

Since everything is to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be, conducting yourselves in holiness and devotion, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be dissolved in flames and the elements melted by fire.

But according to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.

Therefore, beloved, since you await these things, be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him, at peace.

GOSPEL Mark 1:1-8

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God. As it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins.

John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey.





### CLERGY REFLECTION

Advent, as we know, is a time of preparation. The Church also gives us a great model of preparing for the Lord: Mary. On December 8, we celebrated the Immaculate Conception of Mary. God desires us to be prepared to receive Him, but God also plays by His own rules. He prepares Mary, preserving her from original sin, to be the chosen vessel to receive Jesus in the flesh. This Tuesday is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Her appearance to St. Juan Diego shows that while she is an historical figure, she is not merely a statue on a shelf. Her mission continues to help us prepare to receive her Son. As much as Advent is about the preparation for the coming of Our Lord, it is also a time for greater devotion to His mother.

The Marian hymn for Advent is called the *Alma Redemptoris Mater*. My favorite line in the hymn is "Star of the Sea." We have many titles to Our Lady, but this one is a particular favorite of mine. I've never spent the night on the water, but I can only imagine the absolute darkness (when the moon isn't shining brightly) with no light pollution. As beautiful it would be, I can also imagine how afraid I may be. It is difficult, and at times risky, to move about in the dark—all the more on the sea.

This is the case in our spiritual life, too. There are times where we may feel we are in darkness—suffering, pain, the feeling of abandonment. While we know God doesn't abandon us, it can feel like that at times. Mary, the Star of the Sea, can continue to illuminate the path for us. Her witness and intercession are gifts often overlooked.

As we prepare for the birth of Jesus, may we look to His mother to be our model and our guide!
