

GOSPEL

John 1:6-8, 19-28

A man named John was sent from God.

He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.

He was not the light, but came to testify to the light.

And this is the testimony of John.

When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?"

He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted,

"I am not the Christ."

So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not."

"Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No."

So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said: "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent.

They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?"

John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie."

This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.


ECCE AGNUS DEI







CLERGY REFLECTION

Gaudete Sunday

Advent guides us to explore what Christmas means to us personally and to discover what the greatest gift we can give to our family, friends and the world. The traditional themes of Advent allow us - through meditation, prayer, and affirmation - to contemplate ways to share our deepest gifts: hope and faith, peace, love, and joy.

A poor single mother had three kids and the kids hardly went to church because they were busy searching for their daily food. Sometimes they ate from the trash. One day their mother took them to the church and that very day a parish priest in his homily preached about the four different themes of advent season; hope, peace, joy, and love. He also talked about 'good news for the poor' so when they went back to their home the kids asked their mother "what does it mean to proclaim good news to the poor?" And said "how can they rejoice while they are suffering?" She explained everything and said "we hope in faith, we rejoice hoping that God will provide our daily bread on Christmas day" but they waited until the vigil and the kids could not see any one to help them. Finally they said to their mother "if God is not providing anything we are not going to believe him anymore." She kept telling them to have faith and hope and they will see God's caring love. They had nothing to cook and eat but early in the dawn on Christmas day a pet dog came into the kitchen with a leg of lamb. The mother saw before all and washed the meat and started cooking it, because she did not want to disappoint God. When the kids woke up they saw their mother cutting the meat and came close and asked her where did she get the meat and she replied "God provided". From that day the kids became devoted faithful and celebrated Christmas very well.

Believing in God's providence let us then, ask the Spirit to draw us beyond the glitter and even the welcome good - will of this Advent season to a deeper learning of God's ways for our own lives. 'The time' has come – the moment of opportunity. What difference will the birth of Jesus within each one of us make this Christmas, and will it be good news for the poor?
