Reminder - This year the Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas are both days of obligation. The Sunday obligation may be fulfilled either with the Saturday, Vigil Mass or one of the Sunday Morning Masses (7:30, 9:15 or 11:00am). Christmas is fulfilled with any of the Vigil Masses (after 4 pm) on Christmas Eve or any of the Christmas Day Masses.

CLERGY REFLECTION

Late on Christmas Eve 1914, a remarkable event occurred that demonstrated the true meaning of Christmas: peace and good will overshadowed war and death. Men of the British Army heard German troops in the trenches opposite them singing Christmas carols and patriotic songs, and saw lanterns and small fir trees along their trenches. Messages began to be shouted back and forth between the two enemies. The following day, British and German soldiers cautiously rose from their trenches and gazed across at each other before slowly proceeding to the center of No Man's Land – without rifles and grenades. They met and talked at first. Then, with the ice broke, they began to exchange gifts, take photographs and play impromptu games of football (soccer). Germans shared their cigarettes; the Brits shared their chocolate. Both sides shared their libations with one another. They laughed and sang together. Showed each other pictures of their families and girlfriends. Friendships were made. They also buried casualties and repaired trenches and dugouts. There was no killing that day. Hatred and ethnic rivalries ceased. After Boxing Day (December 26), meetings in no man's land dwindled out. After two weeks, the war resumed. Some officers were unhappy at the truce and worried that it would undermine the fighting spirit of their troops. After 1914, the High Commands on both sides tried to prevent any truces on a similar scale from happening again. They even threatened execution of any soldiers fraternizing with the enemy during a cease-fire of any kind. Despite this, there were some isolated incidents of soldiers holding brief truces later in the war, especially at Christmas.

To think that the birth of baby in a cave in an unknown part of the world would still have an effect on the human spirit 2,000 years later demonstrates the power of Christ's birth. Even today, as "wars and rumors of wars" (Matt. 24:6) pervade the news, none of this can diminish the joy and the hope that fills our hearts when we gaze into the manger. Even with our own personal problems and struggles of life, nothing can diminish Christmas joy...it emanates within us from the divine. So we continue to pray for peace, and hope for peace. We ask the Prince of peace to cleanse, purify, and transform our lives and our world, so we may recognize Jesus when He returns again.

On behalf of Fr. Pasquale, Fr. Klein and myself, and the Cathedral staff, and our many volunteers, happy last Sunday of Advent...and Merry Christmas! Thank you for all your prayers, Masses, well-wishes and gifts that you have sent our way. It's difficult to write a personal thank you to everyone, but please know of our gratitude for your kindness and generosity towards us. May you and your families have a very Blessed Christmas; and may the birth of Jesus actualize all your hopes, dreams and desires.
