



GOSPEL Luke 2:22-40

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, They took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord,

Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, waiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him.

It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, He took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted—and you yourself a sword will pierce—so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived

seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer.

And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.







CLERGY REFLECTION

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, we reflect on the family life of Jesus, Mary and Joseph and how their lives centered on obedience and faithfulness to God. As I reflect on the Holy Family, trying to imagine what life must have been like for Jesus the Son of God, Mary the Mother of God and Joseph the foster father of Jesus, two things come to mind: humility and love. Humility and love are at the very center of each member of the Holy Family. Each live in humility by surrendering their lives to the holy will of their heavenly Father and living in the presence of Jesus' sacrificial love for his parents, Mary's pure love for Jesus and Joseph, and Joseph's unconditional love for Jesus and Mary.

Considering the awe and wonder of the Holy Family compared to the state of family life today can be bewildering as we might view the traditional family as a rarity rather than the norm. We certainly experience the brokenness and dysfunction of families as Julie and I minister to the incarcerated. Even in my own family there are struggles with divorce, marital strife, sibling rivalry, blended families, those not practicing their faith, and the list goes on. So why does family life seem to be under attack in so many ways? My theory is that the thing that threatens Satan the most is what he tries his hardest to destroy. The Holy Family is the greatest assault against Satan as is every family, even those that may be broken and dysfunctional. Every family is a threat to Satan because in it's core the Spirit of God brings forth life. We are all given our identity as members of a family no matter what the circumstances and by virtue of our Baptism we are adopted into the family of our heavenly Father.

Christmas and the Feast of the Holy Family is a wonderful time to reflect on the many blessings that God has given us to enjoy the gift of family. However; for some it can be a difficult time as we experience the reality of the joys and sorrows of family life. As we were handing out the Christmas sacks this past week to the incarcerated, one of the items in the sacks was a bookmark that stated in part that "they are not forgotten." God wants us all to know that no matter what our family situation might be-we are never forgotten as we are beloved members of his holy family. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us.
