#### CLERGY REFLECTIONS

Once again, on behalf of the Cathedral priests and deacons, thank you for your cards, gifts, Masses and prayers for us during the Christmas Season. We are humbled and grateful. May the light of Christ, the Newborn King, reign in your hearts in 2024.

On another note: I want to thank my staff and all the volunteers who stepped up to help with the myriad of responsibilities and details during the Advent and Christmas

seasons. None of this gets done by accident. Shout out to the ushers and greeters and the liturgical ministers who signed up to help with the Christmas Masses. It's a huge sacrifice on their part and I'm incredibly grateful. With that in mind...for some time we have been shortstaffed in the Cathedral Offices. Volunteers help by answering the phones, but the follow-up always comes back to the staff. The workload in the office has increased dramatically in the last three years, and many times Mary Anne and Heidi are working late into the night to make sure that reports, requests, scheduling, financials, bulletins, etc. are completed to make deadlines. Therefore, I have made the decision to restrict public office hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday-Thursday; and 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Fridays. This will allow them to have time to complete the tasks that I give them on a daily basis. Thank you for your understanding of the predicament we find ourselves in. The next time you see them, thank them for going above and beyond the call of duty.

At our quarterly Parish Council Meeting in November, we discussed the Set Ablaze Pastoral Plan. Just because Cathedral has not been linked to another parish doesn't mean that we are not affected by Set Ablaze. Officially, the Cathedral of St. Joseph Parish, along with the St. Josephine Bakhita Ecclesial Community and campus and the Mater Ecclesia Monastery (Adoration Sisters) make up Pastorate 21. Set Ablaze seeks to prioritize and align resources, gifts, talents, clergy and lay faithful in order to build a culture of "lifelong Catholic missionary discipleship" in our diocese. "Lifelong Catholic missionary discipleship" is the definition of the Catholic Church now existing in a Post-Christendom world. Each pastorate, including the Cathedral, has been instructed to develop a pastoral plan (think of it as a longrange plan) focusing on five pillars of the faith: 1. Worship (Mass, Sacraments, Devotions); 2. Discipleship and Evangelization (RCIA, Faith Formation, Missions, Retreats); 3. Service (Community Outreach, Service Projects, Homebound/Nursing Home Ministry); 4. Community (Bible Study Groups, Young Adults, Knights of Columbus, Quilters, etc.); and 5. Education (Catholic School, Home School, St. Joseph Academy Classical Education, Religious Ed, Sacramental Prep). At our August staff retreat at Broom Tree, we began to address these pillars by discussing the "anchors" that give the Cathedral Parish (Pastorate 21) its identity. We actually came up with a Mission Statement: a. To ensure the sacredness, beauty and tradition of Cathedral liturgies; b. To provide avenues that strengthen discipleship and deepen vocational awareness; c. To foster relationships within the Cathedral "faith community" that lead to greater evangelization and discipleship. Now it's time to bring the parish together to discuss and identify other notable markers or anchors that will help develop a pastoral plan for our pastorate. We have scheduled a "town hall" meeting for Tuesday, January 23 at 6:30 pm. Everyone is invited to weigh in on the five pillars of Set Ablaze and how they define Pastorate 21. See you there and have a Happy New Fr. James Morgan Year!


