#### CLERGY REFLECTION

A priest friend of mine once asked a young man in the military what he thought of all the ritual that takes place in the armed forces, things such as salutes, ranks, and formations. Thinking on the spot, a relatively simple answer was given: "I guess it shows that some things are more important than others. It separates the ordinary from the extraordinary."

This past week I was at the Arlington National Cemetery and stood, with many other spectators, before the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. While the honor and respect that we offer to our veterans is already an inspiration, I was particularly struck to see the engagement of the people present. At the changing of the guard, one guard comes to replace another guard, while an accompanying guard comes to address the crowd and escort the switching guards. Precise right angles, perfect walking form, pristine uniforms, and silence turned a busy crowd of tourists (often consumed by noise and mental stimulation) into a crowd that appeared like pilgrims. No eyes were looking down at phones. People were silent. They were drawn in, seeing these guards do something that is far from ordinary.

Ritual separates the ordinary from the extraordinary. That experience reminded me of why Jesus did not abolish ritual. He fulfills the Law and the Old Testament sacrifices, but He does not desire ritual worship to cease. In fact, that is the most consistent way the faith has been passed down: through the Liturgy. Why? God comes to us in the flesh—through the physicality of a body. We're not merely spirits, we are human beings. We are drawn to God, who is purely spiritual, through the physical. "Faith comes from what is heard."

Pope Francis says that "Wonder is an essential part of the liturgical act." The symbols used in the Mass should lead us into wonder—the architecture and music, the vestments and the incense. At its summit, the symbols cease and the reality is realized, as Jesus Himself becomes present in the appearance of bread and wine.

As we find ourselves nestled in this period of Ordinary Time between Christmas and Lent, may we remember the extraordinary gift of the Liturgy. May we come with wonder and be filled with His grace.
