

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Јов 7:1-4, 6-7

Job spoke, saying:

Is not man's life on earth a drudgery? Are not his days those of hirelings? He is a slave who longs for the shade, a hireling who waits for his wages. So I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me. If in bed I say, "When shall I arise?" then the night drags on; I am filled with restlessness until the dawn. My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle; they come to an end without hope. Remember that my life is like the wind; I shall not see happiness again.

Brothers and sisters: If I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it!

If I do so willingly, I have a recompense, but if unwillingly,

then I have been entrusted with a stewardship.

What then is my recompense?

That, when I preach, I offer the gospel free of charge so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel. Although I am free in regard to all, I have made myself a slave

to all so as to win over as many as possible.

To the weak I became weak, to win over the weak.

I have become all things to all, to save at least some.

All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it.

Mark 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John.

Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.

When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him. Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed.

Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.





CLERGY REFLECTION

I'm happy to announce that the final phase of the rectory restoration is underway and its completion will be sometime this summer. The organ is in its first phase of construction, and Juget-Sinclair, the organ builder in Montreal, has provided photos to us of their artisans meticulously honing the new pipes. It's completion and installation will be in July of 2025. It's all very exciting...and somewhat nerve wracking at the same time, as you might imagine. We continue to place these projects and our InSpires Campaign under the power and patronage of the Miraculous Infant Jesus of Prague. With that in mind, as a matter of accountability, I share with you the end-of-campaign-report, as of December 18, 2023. Though the "official" fundraising portion of the campaign is over, we are still taking gifts for the endowments, and any unforeseen contingency costs for the projects. Most pledges have been made over a five-year period, so we are keeping a close eye on liquidity, with the intent of avoiding a loan from the Diocesan Expansion Fund as progress payments are made. A loan would bring with it, of course, interest payments. Again, I'm overwhelmed at the success of the campaign. Thank you for your support, your generosity and your prayers. We continue to move forward as a parish...all for the glory of God!
